

Panopto: Panopto for Video Discussions

Who is this for?

What's this about?

To show the Canisius University faculty and staff how to set up a Panopto Assignment folder for Discussion Videos and/or presentations.

Script

Hi all, this is Tyler Kron-Piatek from Canisius.

In this video, we go over how to set up a Student Assignment Folder in Panopto for video discussions in D2L. This process could even be used for peer presentations. For those that have created a Student Assignment Folder for D2L Dropboxes previously, the process is similar.

Let's get started.

First, we need to create a Panopto Assignment Folder. We also need to make sure that our students can view other student's videos. This makes it a bit different than creating a Panopto Assignment Folder for dropboxes. In a D2L Course, click on Panopto in the Course NavBar. This will take us to the Panopto Dashboard.

Click on the three vertical dots in the upper right corner. Select Settings in the menu that appears. In the Overview tab, click on Create Assignment Folder. This will create a folder that students can submit to. It will automatically take on the name of our course, followed by Assignments.

Now that we have created the assignments folder, we need to make sure our students' can view their peers' videos. Click on the title of the assignment folder. This will take us

to the assignment folder. Click on the three vertical dots in the upper right corner. Click on Settings in the menu that appears.

Click on Settings in the left-sidebar in the pop-up that appears. Check the box to allow viewers to see each other's sessions. We can exit out of the settings and go back to D2L.

In D2L, we can create our discussion prompt. However, unlike a typical discussion prompt, we may want to add some additional information. For example, they must use the Panopto Capture to create a video. Additionally, we may want to also add the tutorials that show students how to use Panopto. This can be done in the Discussion or a module description.

These tutorials are available on the Panopto Wiki Page, linked in the description. Additionally, an example of instructions for using Panopto in Discussions will also be available.
