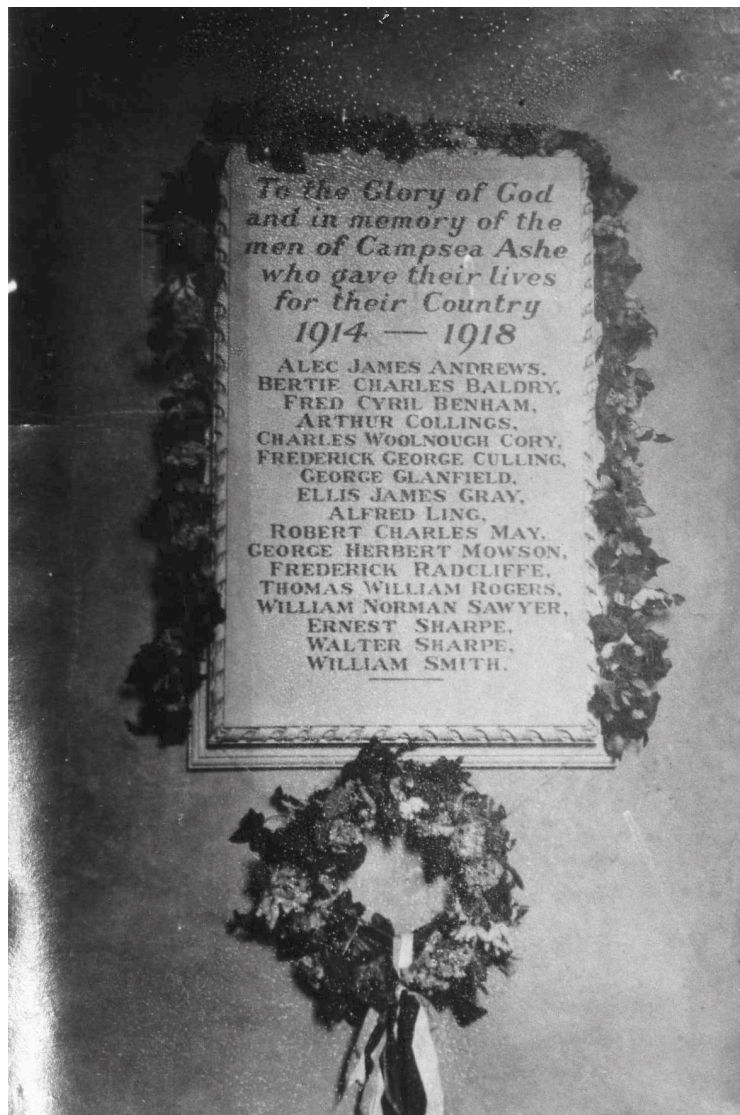




Frederick Radcliffe

Killed 10 April 1917



Frederick Radcliffe was born in 1893 in Burnley, Lancashire, son of Charles and Annie (née Spark) Radcliffe. His father worked in the cotton trade. He had at least one brother (Heber) and a sister (Dorah).

It is known that Frederick moved to Rendlesham sometime after 1911 and was a clerk in the Rendlesham Estate Office. He was also a member of the choir at Campsea Ashe Church.

He enlisted in the Suffolk Regiment and was then commissioned to the Yorks and Lincs Regiment, 35th Company, Machine Gun Corps (Infantry). His Regimental number was 13865. He achieved the rank of lieutenant. Frederick was killed in action on 10th April 1917 aged just 24 years and is remembered at the Arras Memorial.
