1.B. OVERVIEW

Our ever-growing award-winning choir program reaches over 100 students and includes five ensembles that perform a variety of music throughout the year. The mission of the Choral Program at Carteret High School seeks to develop, challenge, and enhance the vocal abilities and musicianship skills while creating a positive learning environment. We collaborate with other school organizations, district officials and the Carteret community. Our continued success wouldn't be possible without the hard work and dedication from our talent pool of students. In addition to developing their musical strengths, students foster self-discipline, cooperation, and commitment as they are developing creativity and demonstrating excellence through music. As a member of the choral program, we all strive to set a positive example of a team by upholding spirit, dedication, excellence, and perseverance.

1.C. ENSEMBLES

CONCERT CHOIR- The Carteret High School Concert Choir is a mixed ensemble that does not require an audition. This choir meets as a curricular course during the school day. Students in this choir range from beginner singers to advanced musicians. All singers will learn to sing with basic vocal technique. Students will also learn the basics of Music Theory. Students who are unable to schedule this class for full credit may enroll in Concert Choir part-time during the after school choir rehearsal on Mondays from 2:45-4:30pm.

CHAMBER CHOIR- Chamber Choir is the most advanced choir ensemble offered at CHS. Members of this chamber ensemble study a large volume of sophisticated and technically difficult literature spanning a wide variety of styles and genres. Chamber Choir frequently appears in Choral Competition around the region and nation. Membership is governed by an intense audition process at the end of the school year. In order to be eligible for this group, you must be in grades 10-12 and have completed one full year of Concert Choir. Chamber Choir is offered for full honors credit for a full-year.

VARSITY VOCALS- Varsity Vocals is the premier a Capella group at Carteret High School. Founded two years ago, Varsity Vocals has performed locally, regionally and statewide such as; Carteret Borough Town Hall, Charity Events, Robert Wood Johnson, New York City- Bryant Park, as well as performing on the field for the Trenton Thunder, and more.

CHORALE- Carteret High School's Chorale is the newest formed ensemble at CHS. Members of this ensemble study a large volume of sophisticated literature that is relevant and inspiring. Chorale acts as a training ensemble for Chamber Choir and participates in choir festivals, competitions and workshops. In order to be eligible for this group, you must be in grades 9-12 and successfully complete an audition.

BELLA VOCE- Carteret High School's Bella Voce is a treble auditioned choir of about 22 students. Members of this ensemble study a large volume of sophisticated and technically difficult literature that is relevant and inspiring to treble voices. Bella Voce participates in choir festivals, competitions and workshops. In order to be eligible for this group, you must be in grades 10-12 and successfully complete an audition. This is an extracurricular ensemble that meets outside of regular school hours on Wednesday's from 3-5pm.

I.D. CHOIR COUNCIL

Choir Leadership Council is a group of students representing the choir department at CHS. They serve their peers and the community through their respective roles and work to make choir a better place. **Appointed Positions:** *President, Secretary/Treasurer, Varsity Vocals Manager, Section Leaders, Director Assistant* **Elected Positions:** *Vice President, Marketing & Communication Chair, Choir Librarian/ Uniform Manager, Choir Logistics Manager,*

I.E. CLASSROOM/ PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS

ATTENDANCE

Because choir is a class where instruction and class work **ONLY** happen during school time, excellent attendance is the most accurate indicator of individual and group success. For those students *only* participating in extracurricular choir ensembles, you must be present at all rehearsals unless the Director has been notified. (NOTE: Excessive absences/tardies may result in the student's dismissal from the ensemble OR credit loss.)

RULES

There are only a few rules in the classroom. They are posted above the door:

1. Your best begins right here (give your best each day).
2. Cooperate and participate as a team (whatever we do, we do together).
3. Work quietly during independent work, even when finished.
4. Raise your hand if you have something to say.
5. Practice proper rehearsal etiquette (talking, gum, food, drink, etc. are inappropriate).

EXTRA REHEARSALS

After-school rehearsals for any students enrolled in a curricular class, will receive **extra credit** for attending any additional after-school rehearsals. Any extra rehearsals for Chamber Choir as we get closer to our competition are mandatory and students receive points for attending.

VOICE LESSONS

All CHS Choir students have the opportunity to sign up and enjoy the privilege of participating in a weekly pullout voice class during their 12th period, as long as students are in good academic standing.

PERFORMANCES

Performances are part of the choral curriculum and are evaluations (TESTS) of what we've learned. In the event of illness or family emergency, please email, send a parent's written note, or telephone Mr. Jackson immediately following the absence to excuse it or obtain an alternate assignment.

CONFLICT POLICY

Concert Choir (after school **only**) students are permitted to only miss three absences. They must let Mr. Jackson know prior to the rehearsal. Varsity Vocals members are permitted three unexcused absences and must use the conflict form policy outlined by Mr. Jackson. Your conflict form must be submitted through the Google Form at least 24 hours in advance and **approved** by Mr. Jackson (**ONLY**) in order for it to be an unexcused absence.

I.F. CONCERT ATTIRE

Black cardigan/sweater (if necessary, shoulders **must** be covered)

Flesh colored hose/stockings should be worn with dresses or skirts

SECTION III: ETIQUETTE

III.A. REHEARSAL ETIQUETTE

1. Be prepared for the rehearsal. Learn your part to the best of your ability. Use sectional time wisely.
2. Obtain your music folder from the slot.
3. Save chewing gum for after the rehearsal.
4. Show respect for the podium and conductor. Give you undivided attention to the rehearsal.
5. Mark your music. When an instruction is given make sure you write it in your music using your pencil.
6. Show respect for one another. Choir is an environment where mistakes will be made and are welcome. But as musicians, we will learn from those mistakes.

III. B. CONCERT ETIQUETTE

1. **Be on time for call-time.** You will be required to sign in for attendance records. Points will be taken off for tardiness.
2. Arrive in appropriate attire.
3. During warm-up time, please **do not** talk or cause any distraction. This crucial time is needed for the ensemble in order to focus on the music.
4. Try to be as professional as possible. From walking with a purpose, to making beautiful music- professionalism should be shown.

III. C. TRAVEL ETIQUETTE

Throughout the year, the choir may have the opportunity to travel or invite a guest speaker to do a choral workshop. You must keep yourself in good academic standing in order to travel. Remember to be respectful of all people involved. You are not only representing yourself but you are representing the entire community of Carteret High School.

SECTION IV: FINANCIAL INFORMATION

IV.A. FUNDRAISING

Our students are able to enjoy the privileges of this program in large part because of the fundraising done by individuals, families, and other organizations. We have to fundraise most of the costs involved with running an award-winning program each year. Fundraisers will be announced as the opportunities open. We HIGHLY ENCOURAGE all students to participate in fundraisers to help with the financials. Please note: Fundraised money is non-refundable.

(Please note that no one is ever kept from participating due to lack of funds. Students or parents in need of financial assistance should bring it to the attention of Mr. Jackson as soon as possible.)

IV. B. PARENT CHOIR COUNCIL

PURPOSE/MEMBERSHIP

The purpose of the CPC is to provide assistance to the CHS Choral Department. The CPC will cooperate with the Choral Director, and CHS Administrators and will lend all possible financial, physical, and moral support to the choirs of Carteret High School:

IV. C. FIELD TRIPS

FESTIVALS/COMPETITIONS

Festivals/ Competition season is usually in the Spring and the Carteret HS Choirs will go to 4-6 festivals/competitions. Not all ensembles will attend every competition/festival. While competitions enhance the performing opportunity and further craft, they also provide a friendly-competitive edge.

CHAMBER CHOIR TRIP

IV. D. MONIES OWED

CUT-TIME

Chamber Choir students will be using Cuttime.net to track their financial obligations. Students and parents can log in at any point to see how much a student owes for their next payment. Monies owed from fundraisers/uniforms/etc. are due on the dates given. If monies owed are not received promptly, students will have the debt placed on their student account, preventing them from receiving schedules, report cards, and graduating.

SECTION III: APPENDIX

III.A. Why Study Music?

- I. **Music is a Science.** It is exact, specific, and demands exact acoustics. A score is a chart or graph, which indicates frequencies, intensities, volume changes, melody, and harmony all at once and with the most exact control of time.
- II. **Music is Mathematical.** Rhythmically, it is based on divisions of time into precise fractions which must be done instantaneously, not worked out on paper.
- III. **Music is a Foreign Language.** Most of the terms are in Italian, German, or French. The notation is certainly not English but a highly developed kind of shorthand that uses symbols to represent ideas. Music itself is the most complete and universal language.
- IV. **Music is History.** Music reflects the environment and time of its creation, including its national and racial sources.
- V. **Music is Physical Education.** It requires fantastic coordination of fingers, hands, arms, lip, cheek, and facial muscles, and extraordinary control of the back, stomach, and chest muscles, which respond instantly to the sound the ear hears and the mind interprets.
- VI. **Music Develops Insight and Demands Research.** Organized, independent thought is required.
- VII. **Music is all of these things, but most of all, Music Is Art.** It allows a human being to take all these technical terms, facts, and techniques and use them to create emotion. That is one thing science cannot duplicate: humanism, feeling, emotion, call it what you will.

TRAVEL:

1. Students must conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the entire choir.
2. There will be no consumption of alcoholic beverages, no use of mood altering/illegal drugs, no use of tobacco and no smoking of any substance in accordance with CSD policies.
3. Students will not travel alone during the course of the tour. Groups of 3 or more are mandatory.
4. Students traveling with the Carteret HS Chamber Choir will not reveal travel information to strangers. (i.e. Hotel information or itinerary)
5. Students will not ride in any vehicle other than the chartered bus without the permission of the director.
6. Boys are NEVER allowed in girl's rooms/girls are NEVER allowed in boy's rooms. There will be a location within the hotel where students will be encouraged to congregate and socialize.
7. Open Door policy will be in effect until lights out time which will be deemed by the Director
8. An evening "room check" time will be announced. After a chaperone has visually checked the student's room, NO STUDENT MAY LEAVE THE ROOM FOR ANY REASON. Chaperone phone numbers and room numbers will be provided to all students in the event of any emergency.
9. Only music devices with headsets are allowed.
10. Any additional costs charged to a room will be the responsibility of the occupants and will be paid to the hotel prior to check out.
