### MONDAY AFTERSCHOOL (3-4pm or 4:30) (start dates vary)

#### Natural Arts (K-2) with Ms. Cassandra begins 9/22 ends 12/1

Where nature and art collide, this program will focus on how we can use the materials nature provides to explore creativity and expression through art. There will be opportunities for open ended art, collaboration, friendly competition, and of course fun. While the weather provides access, sessions will have time spent outside, gathering and making art with the leaves, stems, pebbles, grasses, and other tangibles and textures that the JFK grounds provide. As the weather transitions, the sessions will be inside with nature coming in to continue the fun. This class focuses on the Creativity GX in the area of Visual Arts.

The Best Me is a playful, engaging class that focuses on building social-emotional skills like self-awareness, empathy, emotional regulation, and problem-solving. It blends creative activities, movement, storytelling, role-play, and more with research-based strategies to help children thrive socially, emotionally, and academically in a safe, supportive and fun environment. Come join us and shine from the inside out! **New this year,** I will be using my graduate-level counseling training to build upon my existing skills to optimize the learning experience for students. Part of my training includes taking non-identifying notes (after class). There will be a consent form for each family to sign if your child is enrolled in this class. This class focuses on the Wellbeing GX in the area of Social-Emotional Health.

The Recess Club (Respecting Every Culture, Expression, Self & Story) (3rd-5th) with Ms. Nia begins 9/22 ends 12/1

This program/offering was designed to benefit the BIPOC population (Black, Brown, Asian, and Indigenous). All are welcome. It's a safe space to explore culture, build confidence, and grow as leaders. Students will celebrate their cultures through food, music, stories, and art, develop leadership skills with team activities and public speaking, express themselves creatively through art, journaling, and music, and build friendships and support each other through service projects. This class focuses on the Cultural and Community GX in the area of Cross-Cultural Engagement.

DREAM2 Mentoring Program at JFK for students in 3rd-4th grade begins 11/3 ends in May 2026 DREAM2 will be offering this mentoring program to students that have not participated in this program before. The commitment is for the entire school year. Dream 2 will be training mentors in Sept/Oct to work with their mentees afterschool beginning November 3rd.

The first meeting day for **mentees and mentors** will be **Monday, November 3rd.** The DREAM Program is a mentoring program that pairs high school students with elementary school students to form a strong mentoring relationship. Most of our meetings happen at the school with occasional field trips. <u>Please let us know on the registration form on the next page if your child is interested in a HS mentor.</u> When considering if your student would be a good fit for this mentoring program please review the information below and be able to answer yes to the following questions:

- Would your student benefit from having a high school mentor?
- Will your student be excited to try new things and participate in the activities? The activities we do are created and led by high school students and vary a lot.
- Would your student be able to show up most Mondays for the entire school year so they can form a strong connection with their mentor?
- The program is mostly led by the high school students with support and guidance from the DREAM2 staff. Will your student be able to consistently follow the HEART expectations with their mentor including during the occasional off site field trips?

#### Rosie's Girls for 5th graders and non conforming youth in partnership with Vermont Works for Women at the MS Art Room A173 begins 9/23 ends 11/4

Rosie's Girls® is a trades and career exploration program for 5th graders and middle school girls\*. Through hands-on learning and a research-based social/emotional curriculum called Power Skills, Rosie's Girls helps youth break down gender stereotypes, develop self-confidence and build connections. Last year Winooski RG participants created a cornhole set and giant dice for the MS school! New projects could include storage benches, cubbies or folding beach chairs. This class focuses on the Persistence GX in the area of Math Reasoning. \*Rosie's Girls welcomes anyone who identifies as a girl regardless of assignment at birth, as well as youth who are non-binary or gender expansive who are comfortable in a girl-centered space. This class supports growth in the Persistence GX in the GP of Math Reasoning. Class meets until 4:30.
