Chris will send mocks of UI and emails for review.

Ee provided an overview of less obvious parts of code base to be aware of:

- Pyramid ACL is used for access control. Warehouse currently uses legacy ACL syntax via a compatibility layer, but we want to use the new ACL syntax for this project and in the future. Best way to get started is reading through the new Pyramid documentation on ACL and the guide on upgrading from legacy ACL. Ee can contact Pyramid developers with any questions.
- For feature flags, we should add AdminFlagValue.DISABLE_ORGANIZATIONS to warehouse/admin/flags.py:L20-L26.

We will be targeting end of next week (Fri 15 Apr 2022) for implementing the first two features:

- 1. Create an Organization account (#11070)
- 2. Approve account (<u>#11087</u>)

Project board was shared publicly for community visibility. Matt and Chris will add subtasks for each issue (without creating separate "sub-issues") and link issues to pull requests.

- Question- For org type choices, what terms to use to describe 'company' accounts? Suggestion-This question will require more thought to decide the final list of choices.
 Question about org. size is a good thing to add to the form.

- There are more sprint 2 issues being coded than originally planned as they have similar views. There might be slight delays getting the PRs ready due to delays from sprint 1.
- Question- Should the billing manager only have billing permissions or should they also have owner permissions? Answer- Billing manager should be able to modify/update billing details. For a small organization, the owner can create another user account for the billing manager even though both roles might be handled by the same person.
- Question- Should the PyPI admins have any other responsibilities besides approving accounts? Answer- As the admin is usually a volunteer, we do not want to add more responsibilities.
- A user can remove themselves from the organization. But the account should always have one owner and if the last owner decides to remove themselves, then it should trigger a message to transfer the projects to another user/organization.
- It was decided that user interviews would be more productive if it combined issues from sprint 1 and 2.

- Clarifications regarding whether new issues have been created and they need to be added to the project board.
- There are no blockers with the code. Clarifications regarding member roles will be done during code review.

- Ee has limited availability for the next few days
- Question- Events report when orgs. are created. If an org invite is deleted or expires, should the event be deleted. Answer- Events are immutable. They should not be deleted.
- Reuse of org names should not be allowed. There is an outstanding issue on PyPI regarding soft deletion. Usernames can be reused but this is not ideal. Make the relationship between catalog entry and org id nullable. If there is any constraint regarding org invite deletion or expiry, raise it in the PR.
- Email subject lines are either specific or generic. Is there a preference with either one? Generic events are usually bulk events and should have a generic subject line. Org events are not bulk events and should have specific subject lines except for invitation issues/acceptance/decline.
- Should past emails/UI be brought up to date? Yes but only if it does not take too much time. The scope should not change to updating all past emails/UI.
- Before launch, there should be a drop down that gathers information about company type, size of org and number of users. The company types are enterprise, startups, corporations, non-profit, community.

- Projects are created via twine. Should the org owner be able to create a project on the website? Suggestion- That is a massive piece of work that is out of scope of this project. It does not fit within what we are trying to accomplish with organization accounts. Confirm with Ee.
- The project progress has been good so far. Major issues on the backlog are related to team management. Depending on when the code review takes place, deleting and renaming account issues could be included in user testing.
- A general suggestion was to allot more time (2 weeks) for onboarding.

- Ability to create a new project is within scope of the org account project. Currently, the user will have to upload a project to PyPI and then transfer it to the org. There is a functionality in PyPI to release a prohibited project name to a user. This is done by creating an empty project and then releasing it to the user. Use the same functionality for any user to create an empty project with a name and assign user permissions to it.

There will be no association table to store the relationship between org and project. There will be no ACL between org and project. Relationships come from teams and users. Owner can assign permission once a project has been created. Any user within org can create a project. They have an owner role.
- If an owner is removed from org, they still remain the owner of the project.

- Mike has worked with Python >20 years. Has worked mostly in development and operations and currently works at LeafLink. Mike loves working on OS projects. Mike has used PyPI as a consumer and has been publishing packages for around 7 years. Currently, Mike contributes to Warehouse. Mike signed up for user testing as he has seen the PRs around the org account. Mike was a contributor to the Chef ecosystem where flat namespacing was considered. Namespacing was also seen on npm and Github. Mike is interested in extending corporate namespace to sub namespacing. Mike and team use the PyPI website 1-2 times per week. The team has implemented a package gateway on Amazon which provides a pull through proxy for PyPI where an end user can get private and public PyPI with one config. This eases the load on the CDN.
- Mike was able to log in, create an organisation account, add members to the organisation, assign user roles, remove members, cancel user invitations and accept/reject user invites.
- Suggestion 1: The role descriptions should be displayed better. Possibly break it up into a list similar to sentry access management. One line descriptions would be great. Once the role description is dismissed, it is hard to get it back.
- Suggestion 2: Can't see what role each user has been assigned when the invitation is still pending. Can't change the role back to what it was.
- Suggestion 3: If there are 100s of users, how to filter them?
- Suggestion 4: Role descriptions can be moved to the bottom of the page
- Suggestion 5: Is there an audit log of operations to see who was invited, revoked within the org
- Suggestion 6: When removing a user from the org, a prompt should appear asking 'Are you sure?'

- Suggestion 7: Is it not clear what removing a user entails. Would all associations get lost? Do tokens get revoked? This needs to be described.
- Suggestion 8: The email to the user who has been removed from an organisation should mention the consequences of being removed from an organisation. Mention facts like local development artefacts like keys will no longer be valid.
- Suggestion 9: In the email to the user who has been invited to join the organisation, add the actual link to the organisation. All emails should contain a link to the organisation.
- Suggestion 10: A user cannot leave the organisation if they have created it. Is this correct behaviour?
- Suggestion 11: When declining an org invite, add a box to explain why the invite was declined.
- Suggestion 12: When changing the user role, a Save button appears. This button should move to the side so that the page would not expand. There should also be a cancel button. The dropdown style is different from the one on the top right. There is a visual language disconnect.
- Suggestion 13: Add red tone for required items.
- Suggestion 14: Expose user info in the admin dashboard.
- Suggestion 15: When an organisation account request has been submitted, there is no information about the expected timeline for approval.
- Suggestion 16: There is no way to revoke creating an organisation
- Suggestion 17: The company/community organisation list does not differentiate the two. Add an icon to indicate the type of organisation.
- Suggestion 18: Describe what is within scope of organisation account features. There could be an expectation that namespacing is included. Describe at the top of the create organisation page and add a link to the full description.
- Suggestion 19: The billing manager role should allow billing account email address for each org
- Suggestion 20: When changing the role of a member, once the change has been saved and the page is refreshed a message appears asking for confirmation. The form resubmission should redirect to the direct page and not to the response.
- Suggestion 21: Improve clicking url in emails when using ngrok.
- Question 1: Will there be any namesquatting and how will it be handled? The admin will manually approve all org requests until it makes sense to do so. Then this will be ramped up to allow automated approval when domains match.
- There will be a limit on the number of outstanding org requests per user.
- The general feedback was that the visual styling has to improve. More information about what is
 possible within an organisation account should be shared so that false expectations are not
 created.

- Bernat and Jürgen maintain the tox project. Currently, upload is restricted to one user whose API token has been shared. If another user wants to upload, the token will have to be shared or it is not possible. If there is an organisation token, anyone within the organisation can upload a project. Users can have access to sub projects. Jürgen's team at Canonical has 20-30 projects on PyPI. When someone joins the organisation, they cannot publish immediately. Organisation accounts will make managing projects and users easy. Bernat uses the PyPI website once a month to generate the API key. Jürgen uses the website once a week as project admin and daily as a user.
- They were able to create an org account, add members, assign user roles, cancel user invitations, accept and reject user invitations successfully.
- Suggestion 1: The link for creating an org account should be available at the bottom of the page. The link in the drop down box is not intuitive. The user should not have to log in to know that they can create an org account.
- Suggestion 2: When creating an organization, the create page should disappear once the request has been submitted. It should be replaced with a message saying that the user should wait for the admin and for how many days.
- Suggestion 3: When a user has been invited to join an organization, add a banner at the top of the page to make it obvious that the user has a pending invitation,
- Question 1: Will there be any requirement to enforce 2FA? This is not decided yet.
- Suggestion 4: Companies will require 2FA to be activated.
- Suggestion 5: For a user without 2FA, make it intuitive to change the status. Show ways to change it.

- Suggestion 6: When removing a member from an org, a confirmation message should appear asking the owner to confirm it.
- Suggestion 7: Remove button should be red
- Suggestion 8: Provide a select option to select all users or subset of users and perform an operation on those users.
- Suggestion 9: When revoking an invitation, a confirmation message is required.
- Suggestion 10: All invitation requests should have an expiry date. A week is ideal.
- Suggestion 11: When a user wants to remove themselves from an org, the option should be 'Leave' rather than 'Remove'
- Suggestion 12: The organization header should be made more prominent with the people in that org displayed as a tree
- Suggestion 13: When rejecting an org invite, a confirmation message should appear. The user should be able to provide a reason for declining the invite and this message should appear in the email to the owner.
- Suggestion 14: The input field's breadth in the create organization page can be increased so that there is no wasted space on the right
- Suggestion 15: When creating an account, the default option should be 'Community'. A tooltip message should describe the company description.
- Suggestion 16: When changing a user role, a banner should show which user and what role was changed.
- Suggestion 17: The description of user roles should be collapsible rather than dismissable. It should be easy to view the description once it has been collapsed. Or use a tooltip that will describe the roles when rolling over the role.
- General feedback- The features are clear and do not require a manual. The UI is usable with minor modifications. The features met expectations.

- <u>Jakub</u> manages <u>Red-DiscordBot</u>. The team consists of developers and QA. A subset of developers are in charge of releases in order to minimise security risks. Currently, the pipeline that exists for releases uses a token that has been generated by one user. While release managers have access to the projects they have to use a single token for release. Jakub was interested in testing to see if the features could help the team. Jakub uses the PyPI website to look up dependencies.
- Jakub was able to create an account, add members, assign user roles, remove members, cancel user invitations, accept/reject user invitations.
- The role description is useful. They seem in line with expectations.
- Suggestion 1: There is no confirmation when removing a member. This could lead to members being removed accidentally.
- Suggestion 2: The email received when a member is removed from an org does not contain name of org in quotes
- Suggestion 3: The link to org should be added in email
- General feedback: It is obvious to understand how the features work. The page is easy to navigate. The features do meet expectations. Jakub wanted to know what each role would do and it is good to know there is a hierarchy in the roles available in the org account.

Owner/maintainer role makes sense for individual users; the semantics will have to have to change for teams- teams administer a project, teams can upload a project, teams cannot delete a release
- When transferring a project does the previous owner lose ownership? When a project is
 transferred to an org, it should remove ownerships for all individual users and also prevent
 invitation to individual owners. Project should have no new direct roles for ownership, can assign
 maintainer roles. Explicit ownership records need not exist in the DB. Permission level can be
 downgraded, cannot be upgraded, add notes to a confirmation text box.
- Does it make sense to allow members of an org to be added as collaborators of a project or should it be done only via teams? If this team is assigned access to a project and org gives permissions for some project, Github shows explicit dialogue of what adding a member will allow. Default groups not recommended, direct assignment to a project is not recommended to an individual. For external collabs, add a red badge to indicate that.

Michael suggested the following -

• For the org account name, the validation should also be at the client side

- It should be clear that for companies, the features will be available only when billing details are added
- When a role is assigned to a member, the email shows the enum rather than the role name (organizationroletype.billingmanager)
- The org account change is not intuitive. The UI should mention that to change the org account, the user should scroll down
- There is no email when the org name is changed (not the account)
- Deleting an account should mention what will happen to teams and members
- Teams are listed by insert order. They should be listed by alpha sort or give the owner the ability to sort the team names.
- When adding a member to a team, the message that no org owner, manager or member found with that name seems excessive. Add a link to the list of members.
- When adding a member to a team, if no member exists in the org, the owner should be able to invite the member to join the org and team
- Listing team and collaborators does not make sense (https://capture.dropbox.com/00HEkfPOLCdHY6Bm)
- Org link should not be there under collaborator if the org name at the top is not a link
- Clicking on manage organization leads to People but it is second on the list
