### What is PBIS?

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a proactive approach for establishing behavioral supports needed for all students. These supports promote social, emotional, and academic success. Attention is focused on creating and sustaining school-wide, classroom, and individual systems of support that improve lifestyle results (personal, health, social, and family) for all students. PBIS targets and redirects misbehavior while encouraging desired behaviors.

## What does PBIS look like at Granite Oaks?

The PBIS Leadership Team has created a behavioral matrix to clarify positive behavior expectations on campus. This matrix guided classroom lessons taught during our Enrichment/SSR period. These PBIS lessons focused on using positive behavior at specific campus locations such as classrooms, restrooms, locker rooms, library, and special events like an assembly or rally.

After the lessons were completed, all staff and students gathered for a "Welcome to the Nest Rally" to celebrate our school creed of being **Respectful**, **Responsible**, and **Resilient**.

In addition to the classroom lessons and rally, positive behavior was encouraged through the use of Fabulous Falcons. Fabulous Falcons are tickets given to students for meeting the expectations of the matrix. Fabulous Falcons are collected by students, which can be exchanged for prizes such as gift cards.

# How effective was our PBIS implementation?

Overall, the PBIS launch was successful for the 2016-2017 school year. A classroom management self-assessment survey was sent to staff in the spring of 2017; the majority of staff had the following in place in their respective classrooms:

- 1. Defining and teaching behavioral expectations
- 2. Establishing routines and effective learning environment
- 3. Maximizing student engagement
- 4. Developing a continuum of strategies for response to problem behavior

Areas to focus on as a PBIS school were additional time and support implementing the continuum of strategies to acknowledge appropriate behavior. Our Action Plan for 2017-2018 will incorporate these areas of need with our Tier II supports.

#### Our Action Plan for 2017-18

- 1. Expand our PBIS Team to include more representative teaching staff and family members. Our Tier I team will meet monthly, the third Wednesday of every month before school.
- Change the format of the PBIS Leadership Team meetings to assess student needs and focus on specific behaviors based on analyzing the System Wide Information System (SWIS) data
- Review and solidify Tier I supports. Implement Tier II supports.
- Continue to communicate progress on PBIS implementation to parents, families, and community utilizing our website, E-blasts, and Counselor Corner.
- Continue to sustain our strong PBIS implementation across all Tiers, with the goal of creating a campus culture focused on Respectful, Responsible, and Resilient student behavior.
