# Lesson Title: Catch Your Name

**Grade:** K-3 **Risk:** Low

#### Materials:

Large ballMusic

### Objective(s):

 Students will practice listening and building connections while tossing a ball around

#### **Procedure:**

- 1. Round 1: Catch your name- Gather students in a circle and tell them that they are going to play a game using a ball. Explain that you will stand in the center of the circle and throw the ball to each child.
- 2. When one catches the ball, he or she will say his or her name and then throw it back to you.
- 3. Go around the circle a few times so students have an opportunity to learn the game and each other's names.
- 4. Invite students to take turns throwing the ball to each of their classmates.
- 5. Round 2: Throw it to a friend- Once students have learned all of their classmates' names, invite them to play this game. Suggest students make a circle, and let one student begin the game by calling out the name of one of his or her friends and then throwing the ball to that student.
- 6. The student who catches the ball will call out another student's name before throwing the ball to him or her.
- 7. Assist students to make sure that all of their classmates are included in the game.
- 8. Round 3: Catch your name and boogie-Have students make a circle. Ask one student to step into the center of the circle.

- 9. Explain that the student in the center will throw the ball in the air and call out the name of one of his or her classmates.
- 10. The student whose name is called will run to the center of the circle and catch the ball. Once the ball is caught, he or she will then create a simple movement like wiggling, jumping, or moving his or her arms. Everyone follows along. Play lively music to accompany the game.

\*\*\*Remember: If you are playing the game with very young children, you can ask them to sit in the circle and roll the ball instead of throwing it.
