 for working on curricula but for improving upon what's been done in the past. Ideally, this
 should lead to stronger learning, stronger teaching, stronger communication, and stronger
 overall programmatic design. And thank you to Joy and Tom and the Office of Instruction for the
 processing that follows CC approvals.
 - The dean-approval deadline for courses, addenda, and programs wishing for a fall '25 effective date will be September 20. As always, that's a Friday 5 pm deadline.

Discussion Items (3:15-4:30, after BREAK)

- **3:15** Nominations and voting for AY 24-25 Curriculum Committee Chair
 - Tom Boegel called for nominations. Craig was nominated. There was a second. There was a call to close nominations. Craig accepted the nomination and was re-elected chair unanimously.
- 3:25 GE/GR outcomes mapping for fall '25
 - Priority = Courses moving into the new Title 5 Areas: 1B (Oral Communication and Critical Thinking) and
 2 (Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning). Those ~180 outlines will need to receive
 Curriculum Committee approval and then meet GE articulation approval deadlines.
 - The GE/GR Subcommittee met on 4/24 to build upon the GE Squad's area definitional work and to review and create outcomes sub-elements for Cal-GETC mapping. That mapping will be very similar to the Title 5 mapping.
 - If those outlines have, say, a 2019 approval date as opposed to a 2022 approval, it is likely that more
 work besides mapping updates will be needed to address outline standards that have been reinforced
 the past few years.
 - What about new Cal-GETC requests, say, for courses that had local or CSU-only approval but not IGETC.
 Courses already with IGETC approval are automatically okay for Cal-GETC.
 - Which courses/areas can be edited under the hood for updated local (Title 5) mapping and Cal-GETC mapping and not require in-person Curriculum Committee meeting discussion? And whose fingers will handle that labor?
 - Of course, any outline that is nearing the end of its 6-year shelf life should be assessed and modified in a timely manner to avoid deactivation and to strengthen content, goals, and methodology.

- As listed on the agenda, processing priority will be given to GE courses in new local GE areas 1B and 2 since those courses will need CC approval and then go for state-level approvals. Math (Area 2) was a local graduation requirement, not a GE area. Area 1B (Oral Communication and Critical Thinking) contains all of the Area A (Analytical Reasoning and Communication) courses temporarily for this transitional year, but by fall '25 there needs to be a meaningful split justifying 1B-1 (Oral Communication) and 1B-2 (Critical Thinking) acceptance. Old Area A and is not quite the same as new Area 1B. This is why the new mapping must be done and the outlines must receive CC approval early this fall.
- Courses that will not be pursuing, say, Area 1B-2, and are <u>not</u> yet due to be modified because
 of the 6-year revision cycle, may simply inform <u>ccchair@ccsf.edu</u> that they will not be trying
 to extend their Area A status into the new 1B.
- Some courses may not pursue Cal-GETC but may be fine as a UC-transferable elective.
- Some old Area A courses without a MATH prefix should check on new Area 2 possibilities.
- There was also discussion about expedited modification and under-the-hood possibilities, but criteria need to be established. Going under the hood with outlines can be risky because it alters an outlines history (sort of like Flash altering time and creating the Flashpoint), but since mapping is not reviewed by the CCCCO, there may be instances with, say, 2022-23-approved outlines that only need a mapping adjustment where we can go under the hood.
- Timing is also a factor because these modifications will impact the four liberal arts associate degrees, CCSF's most popular degrees, as they are made up entirely of GE courses, unlike traditional majors.
- In short, there are catalog issues and state-approval, and it is also important that we preserve a course outline's history and also expedite whenever possible and ethical.
- In general, there will be a number of organizational challenges during the updating and approval processes for the 900+ GE/GR outlines, but we'll get it done.

3:45 Squad time and report-backs

- The GE and Ethnic Studies Squads merged and built upon work in progress with Cal-GETC 1B and 1C (a new area) standards and why our Title 5-approved outcomes elements can't just be carried over. They also reviewed drafts of paragraphs defining the new local 1B and 2 GE areas. They edited outcomes and definitions.
- The Workforce and Noncredit Squads merged to list five ideas that might help both noncredit
 and workforce development flourish even more at CCSF. Ideas included upskilling and NC3
 certificates, short-term certificates, parenting courses for people whose children are in foster
 care, and building on the recent CCSF Connect and John Adams Health Career Showcase
 events.
- The Handbook/Website Squad also met and built upon their previous break through with the handbook focusing more on "theory" and the website resources focusing more on "practice." They identified five things that students should be able to access easily, like the public CurrlQunet search and the Curriculum Committee's mission statement, board policies, and an overview of CC processes. Faculty need easy access to agendas, minutes, the handbook, and clear pathways to what it is that they need to do, such as working on a program not a course or a DEA.

4:25 Nominations and voting for today's <u>Wendy's Member of the Meeting</u>
