# Impact and outcomes of our Sports Premium spend 2024-25

The impact and outcomes of our spending have also continued to be measured against the 5 main strands below.:

#### • Engagement of all pupils in regular physical exercise:

A large proportion of our budget this year has been allocated and spent on ensuring the engagement of all pupils in regular physical exercise is high. This has been achieved through ensuring we, as a school, are well resourced and that we have the equipment needed for active breaks, lunches and active sessions. This year we have delivered a sensory circuits intervention; initially accessed by children with specific SEND needs but as the year progressed this became a widely accessed intervention for many pupils. Again the resourcing and upkeep of this has been a fundamental part of the spend. This year we have invested in Macclesfield Community Sport Trust, to support and enrich our lunchtime delivery of sporting activity. This has allowed for targeted groups of pupils (pupil premium, SEND, previously inactive) to access and engage in regular activity. Our school sports leaders have dedicated a lot of time this year into planning and leading physical activity sessions for our younger pupils and this has really engaged many pupils. We continue to timetable for 2 hours (+) for physical education lessons and we have a comprehensive offer of extra curricular activities; some of which we have invested in to ensure all groups of pupils are engaged.

### • Profile of PE and Sport:

The profile of PE and Sport at Parkroyal continues to remain high and a school priority. We have once again been awarded PLATINUM level for the School Games Mark (for 24/24 and 25/26 in recognition of the work that we continue to do. We have continued to work closely with our SGO, our local secondary schools and other academy trust schools. We have continued to work with external providers and have enhanced our links within the local community further. The awarding of Sportsman and Sportswoman of the year, for the dedication to school sport, continues our legacy of recognising outstanding effort and achievement. It continues to inspire younger children to participate in sports and strive to achieve the award in the future. We have held 3 sports days this year and participated in many internal and external events- always showcasing these to parents and carers and the wider community.

#### • Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff teaching PE:

Early intervention and developing pupils' fundamental skills remain integral to the teaching and learning of PE. Our use of Rugbytots has continued to be impactful (as detailed below) but has also this year supported our early years staff in the delivery of high quality PE lessons; increasing confidence and skills. We have continued to invest in orienteering; an area of the curriculum that we value as important. After the installation of our bespoke course, staff received high quality training. This significantly increased confidence, skills and knowledge in this area of the PE curriculum. PE Passport is embedded in our whole school approach to the delivery of PE.;the app has continued to provide detailed plans, accompanying videos, skill grids and a rigorous assessment proforma to support teaching and learning. After the investment last year in our PE co-ordinator obtaining further qualifications, we have ensured that their learnings have been shared with teachers and staff across school and monitoring of the teaching and learning of PE has been conducted with feedback and support provided to teachers.

#### • Broader experience of range of sports offered:

Our curriculum offers a broad range of sports and to ensure they can be taught effectively, investment in resources has continued. We once again entered a wide range of sporting competitions provided by our SGO and the school games partnership. Our extensive extra curricular offer ensures that pupils receive a broader experience of a range of sports and specialists have been used where necessary. Much of the spending on resources has been to ensure that we are able to not only deliver high quality PE, but to resource a broader range of sports.

Football is the most popular sport at our school (as it is for many schools) so we have invested in specialists to support the delivery of our football but also to go beyond just the playing. A professional football manager has delivered talks around other opportunities in football- away from the pitch, we have had a specialist coach deliver intervention sessions to a group of both disadvantaged and SEND pupils to support their SEMH needs and decision making when playing football and we have provided training to our sports leaders around officiating.

#### • Increased participation in competitive sport:

As part of our MSSP (Macclesfield School Sports Partnership) we attended a large number of different competitions that had very different intents: football (boys and girls), netball, cross country running, hockey, lacrosse, athletics, gymnastics, cricket to name but a few. We paid additional subscription fees this year to ensure more pupils had the opportunity to compete. We also participated in the season long football and netball leagues, fielding A and B teams and where possible C teams. Once again we increased the number of extra curricular opportunities for our pupils and utilised coaches, external providers and the local community/facilities. As part of our academy trust we competed in

events across schools with us organising a trust wide football tournament and competing in a swimming gala. The platinum award for School Games recently being awarded to our school, also demonstrates impressive participation in competitive sport.

**Reporting on Year 6 swimming outcomes** From the 2017 to 2018 academic year, there was a new condition requiring schools to publish how many pupils within their year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
