## Week 4: Love Candle (Purple)

The fourth candle of Advent is called the **Love** candle; as we anticipate Christmas, let us remember our **loving** savior, how he came once as a baby that the world through him might be saved, and how he will return in glory.

The words of Zephaniah

## [Read Zephaniah 3:17]

 The Lord your God is with you, the Mighty Warrior who saves. He will take great delight in you; in his love he will no longer rebuke you, but will rejoice over you with singing.

How do we know that Jesus came in **love** and to demonstrate **love**?

## [Read John 15:9 and 13 and Romans 5:8]

- As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love.
- Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.
- But God demonstrates his own **love** for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

And what does this mean for the followers of Christ? Jesus told his disciples;

[Read John 13:34-35]

• A new command I give you: **Love** one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you **love** one another.

Scripture reminds us that;

## [Read 1 John 4:19]

We love because he first loved us.

Jesus Christ is the true reason for hope, peace, joy, and **love** in this season and forever.
