*AMERICAN COLLEGE TEST (ACT):

The ACT Assessment is a standardized college entrance examination that measures knowledge and skills in English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. Four year universities require either the ACT or SAT I as part of the admission criteria. Consult the catalog of the specific university applying to. A free handbook preparing for the ACT is available in the career center.

**ARMED SERVICES VOCATIONAL APTITUDE BATTERY (ASVAB):

The ASVAB is a career exploration program consisting of a multi-aptitude test battery that helps students explore their interests, abilities, and personal preferences. This test is open to juniors and seniors. It is required for military enrollment but all students are encouraged to take the ASVAB regardless of military interest.

***PRELIMINARY SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TEST (PSAT):

The PSAT is a practice test for the SAT I. It consists of three content areas: verbal, math, and writing. Given to juniors in the fall, the PSAT is also used as a qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship Program, the National Scholarship Service and Fund for Negro Students, and the National Hispanic Scholar Recognition Program.

****ACT WorkKeys:

The ACT WorkKeys assessment measures the cognitive and non-cognitive skills needed for success in the workforce. Students take the Applied Mathematics, Workplace Documents, and Graphic Literacy tests. Based on the scores attained on the three assessments, students may be eligible to earn a Bronze, Silver, Gold, or Platinum Certificate.

Fall of junior year is a good time to take the ACT for the first time. All juniors will take the ACT during the spring semester of their junior year at AHS.
