Dear Parents.

When we sat down to create a school in Corolla, we could not have fathomed that we would be back at the drawing board eight years making our school a virtual one, but here we are. Now, just as then, we are wowed and overwhelmed by the support and positivity from families and community. You all are a huge part of our success and we are grateful to you! And thank you for your amazing feedback to survey. We had a near-whole school response, which really helped us drive and define some of these changes.

As you know, we will not be back in school until May 15, 2020 at the earliest. As this is a learning process for all, we are making adjustments to our original calendar-launch based on feedback from students, parents, our teachers, and other schools. This will provide what we hope are the best possible strategies and learning environment for your students. Below is an overview of our schedule changes.

First things first: The classwork for students 2nd-8th grades tomorrow (Friday, March 27) is all independent work! (No *need* to log in to Zoom, but if you have questions, teachers will be available in their Zoom rooms, and will be alerted by chat messages only if they are away from their desks.)

K and 1st will log in as usual tomorrow at 9am, have social studies right after math, and be done around 11:30am

This schedule decreases your child's face time with the screen and allows for more time for your student to move around, transition, and relocate. The actual workload should stay about the same. Teachers will provide students with specific instructions on the work they are expected to complete independently. Teachers will use Canvas and/ or Google classroom depending on grade level to post assignments. (5th-8th grade students have been working with Canvas calendars and agendas and should continue to do so.)

^{***2}nd grade, your ELA and MATH schedules are the same all five days of the week!

SUNDAY SWITCH OUT AT THE SCHOOL FOR COMPLETED AND NEW WORK:

WEVS teachers are using Tuesdays and Fridays to grade, return, and generate new work for your students. On Sundays, teachers will put folders in a plastic bin outside the schoolhouse with your student's name on it. Please take the envelope and leave any work to be turned in in the folder. You may also use this time to switch out class books. THE FOLDER STAYS IN THE BUCKET. Parents- just take work out and replace with completed work. We will leave hand sanitizer and wipes. (Please clean hands before touching bin, and wipe down bin afterwards.)

ATTENDANCE:

We will count attendance by completion of work. We will informally count attendance with pledge login, but understand that we are dealing with finicky internet, technological difficulties; therefore we are looking to see that tasks are completed per teacher's expectation.

THE WEVS-WAY MINI-PROJECTS:

To keep kids 'interacting' and excited about learning, WEVS will be assigning mini-projects each week, but on an alternating week schedule. (So your students are producing one every other week.) Siblings can work together to produce one project. These will be projects that demonstrate some skill or creative endeavor videotaped (less than 5 minutes) with an explanation of the project. For example, if the project is 'recipe' students must find or create a recipe and record themselves making it OR explaining the final project. Friday afternoons, WEVS students must watch their peers' videos and leave positive and/or constructive feedback. We will use the SEESAW platform for this initially. MORE INFORMATION WILL COME HOME ABOUT THIS ON MONDAY as teachers work together to create a schedule and some project parameters that allows students to demonstrate the highest level of creativity without taxing parents' patience or resources!

PURPOSE OF THE CHANGES:

We want to maintain the WEVS culture and mission even through these uncertain times. Based on the experiences and feedback from the last 10 days, WEVS sought to:

- Lessen the amount of sitting time
- Lessen the amount of screen time
- Lessen the distractions of task completion by the Zoom group forum
- Maintain individual students' cultural contributions to WEVS
- Maintain one-on-one or small-group routines that were occuring, even in small time increments, in class, which is virtually impossible in 'full' Zoom classroom

We understand that this is another adjustment to make, but we are confident that your students can handle the tweaks, and that it will be to everyone's benefit (hopefully including parents!)


DATA SYNTHESIS:






The time spent on the computer is... 26 responses
