### ***Description:***

In this course, participants will be guided through Seesaw learning modules that will teach them the basics of Seesaw, including getting started, getting students & families connected & creating activities. The second day of this workshop will delve into more advanced uses of Seesaw and activity creation, with time given for participants to set up their classes and create activities to use in their classrooms. The instructor will share other favorite digital tools to use in conjunction with Seesaw. This course will include information on using Seesaw for remote learning, as well as for face to face instruction. Educators will leave with a working knowledge of using Seesaw as a digital portfolio and communication tool, as well as several activities created and ready to use in their classrooms.

### ***Outcomes:***

Participants will:

- Understand the benefits of using digital portfolios both in the classroom and for remote learning
- Learn how to connect students and families to Seesaw, and the benefits of connected families
- Apply and use Seesaw creative tools for completing & building activities
- Use Seesaw skills and/or folders to organize learning targets
- Discuss how to best utilize Seesaw for blended and/or remote learning
- Create and share engaging, standards-aligned activities for use in their classrooms
