

Supplies & Materials for Making Homemade Button Note Cards

Tools

- [Circle](#) or [Heart](#) Hole Punch (*affiliate links*)
- [Awls](#) (*affiliate link*) Check with your Industrial Arts teacher for these before buying
- [Hammers](#) (*affiliate link*) Check with your Industrial Arts teacher for these before buying
- Paper Scissors—plain or decorative
- Pinch Clothespins
- White Glue—Elmers or Tacky
- Cutting Boards or Blocks of Wood—check with Industrial Arts teacher for these
- Clear Nail Polish—optional

Supplies

- [Blank Note Cards](#) (*affiliate link*) or plain Card Stock cut to size
- Empty cereal boxes for cardboard buttons
- Old cards or Postcards
- Magazines & Newspapers
- Old Dictionaries or Books —libraries often give these away for free
- Old Sheet Music
- Sports and/or Music Programs
- Scraps of Gift Wrap
- Scrapbooking Paper Scraps
- Fine Jute/Hemp
- Embroidery Floss & Needle
- Thin Sharpies—variety of colors
- Ink Pad & “Thank You” Stamper
- Embellishments—*optional (ribbon, bling, sequins, burlap, etc)*

Tips & Suggestions

- Be creative! Use what you have; keep a box of scraps
- Use decorative scissors for unique edges if you have them
- Borrow what you can from the Industrial Arts department
- Makeup “kits” for your students to keep the project organized and to avoid waste
