Residency Acknowledgement Bill

A bill that allows voters to voluntarily identify their location of residency and have it confirmed

- 1. A resident of a state is someone who voted in its last election
- 2. Governors may reference confirmed residents of their state in their procedures
- 3. No citizen may be discriminated against by the federal government for their residency status
- 4. A citizen may ask the Department of Elections to confirm their residency status with their governor, the Supreme Court, and/or Department of Investigations.
 - a. The Department of Elections must comply with this request, and must not reveal any other information about the citizen's ballot.
