We invite you to submit an artistic interpretation of Torah and Haftarah readings for the Days of Awe, to be published in a bound volume that will provide inspiration to delve deeper into the text. Here's a growing list of those Torah and Haftarah readings.

# Seeking Art Inspired By High Holiday Torah & Haftarah

<u>Bayit: Building Jewish</u>, a spiritual innovation incubator, seeks art for a unique new visual companion to the Days of Awe – anticipated to be the first volume in a multi-part series that will open up the Yamim Nora'im in new ways.

#### **Short Version:**

- <u>Bayit</u> seeks art inspired by high holiday <u>Torah and haftarah readings</u>
- Any medium or style, suitable for printing at 8.5" x 8.5"
- An honorarium of \$180 will be paid to each artist whose work is accepted
- Submission deadline: May 15, 2024
- Submit high-resolution image file, along with artist bio (no more than 150 words), and artist's statement (no more than 250 words) via this google form.

## **Longer Version:**

Because the <u>Torah and haftarah readings for the Yamim Nora'im</u> are rich and multilayered, they're not always accessible. Even with good translations (or Hebrew fluency), sometimes the words don't reach us -- or maybe we're not visual thinkers / learners / pray-ers -- or maybe metaphors feel outmoded or unfamiliar. For some of us maybe the printed text and/or aural experience of hearing Torah and haftarah are intellectually interesting, but not emotionally or spiritually compelling. Enter visual art, which reaches heart and mind in a different way.

This bound volume of artwork will offer another modality for entering into the experience of the high holidays. The art curated and collected here will open doorways into the traditional Torah and haftarah readings\* for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The book can serve as a visual companion to whatever printed mahzor (high holiday prayerbook) is being used at any synagogue, havurah, or minyan across and beyond denominational life. It will also be suitable for use by those who choose to spend the holidays outside of shul settings.

We welcome full-color art in any style or medium (suitable for reproduction in a bound volume.)

(\*Note: different denominations offer different Torah and haftarah readings, and we welcome submissions arising out of any and all of those selections. This volume is pluralist and aspires to offer visual doorways into all of the texts that have become standard across the Jewish movements.)

The Mahzor Companion will be published in the summer of 2024 and available for individual as well as bulk sales.

Source text (tell us which Haftarah or Torah reading it relates to).
Brief description of the artwork and what inspired you to create it, not more than 250
words.
Artist bio, not to exceed 150 words.
