Questions for Your Shabbat Table:

What can a free person -בן חורין do that a slave -עבד cannot? Aren't we lucky to be free people- בני חורין?

This week's Parsha (Tazria Leviticus 12:1-13:59)

This week's Parsha, Tazria is perhaps one of the most memorable in Leviticus. It details how the Israelites would contract certain skin diseases. The Parsha mentions such ailments as boils, rashes and even skin falling off! At first glance, this week's Parsha is simply about disease and how those who are afflicted get healed.

On a deeper level it is so much more than just a documentation of skin diseases and how they are cured. It is believed that the skin afflictions were a result of the people gossiping about their neighbors. This was a physical punishment for a behavior. Since there were no dermatologists in biblical times, the responsibility of the healing fell to the priests. Rather than treat the symptoms, the priests were commanded to banish the afflicted people to live outside of the camp for a period of seven days.

This period of isolation, I believe, was not intended to cure the physical ailments. Instead, this was a time for the infected to reflect on their actions and think about how they can change their behaviors for the future. Only when the infected person was "pure" again, both in mind and body, were they able to rejoin the community.

Questions for your Shabbat Table

- 1. Can bad behavior be transformed into good behavior? How?
- 2. How is changing behavior a kind of healing?
- 3. In what ways are modern day doctors and/or Rabbis descendants of the priests? What kind of healing do they do?
