Malcolm X

Objective:

Students will compare and contrast the means and ends of Malcolm X (prior to 1965) and those associated with the classic Civil Rights movement.

Directions:

We will watch three excerpts of different interviews of Malcolm X. While watching the excerpts, take notes on the following central historical question:

“How do the methods and the goals of Malcolm X (prior to the end of 1964) differ from those of the Civil Rights Movement?”

Using the videos, identify at least three specific differences total (not three for methods and three for goals). Be prepared to discuss with your partners and the class.
