Aspect		Points
Vocab Application	<p>15 vocab terms minimum to earn 1 point. (14 terms is a 0/35)</p> <p>More than 15 terms must be explained, applied, relevant, integrated, and useful to the listener to earn full credit. Vocab explained/applied/integrated will be listed on the side.</p> <p>Fewer than 15 vocabulary accurately applied relevantly will earn 0/35</p>	/35
Clarity	<p>The clarity of presentation: should include fully researched relevant vocabulary and information. Logically organized, all unfamiliar terms explained.</p> <p>Content missed or unclear:</p>	/20
Creativity	<p>Creativity, each talk should be unique, inspiring, and insightful. Could include mnemonics, distinctions, or stories to illustrate vocab.</p> <p>What was done?</p>	/10
Research	<p>Discussion of specific experiments, data sets, research, graphs, charts, from academic sources (cited appropriately) that add tremendously to understanding.</p>	/10
Engagement Interactivity	<p>Engagement, enthusiasm, and interactivity with class. Know your content cold and engage the audience by asking them to visualize, synthesize, remember, evaluate, etc.</p> <p>What was done?</p>	/20
Responsibility	<p>Bibliography: APA format with argument position on the top line. Required.</p> <p>5pts for clearly articulated argument at top of bib and well curated resources, No bib, no TED.</p>	5/5
