## **Gifted and Talented Services Appeal Form**

Each year, identification committees meet to consider students for the district's gifted and talented program. All students are considered through the screening process, as program staff review information from a variety of sources. Each building identification committee is made up of gifted and talented program staff, classroom teacher or teachers, and a building administrator. This committee is charged with the formal identification of students as being "gifted" in Specific Academic areas (math, reading, science or social studies) or in the area of General Intellectual ability (must qualify in at least three academic areas). Information about the identification process may be obtained from the school website or from the guidance office.

Parents/guardians whose children have been considered for inclusion in gifted and talented programming but have not been formally identified may appeal the decision of the identification committee. To do this, complete the form below and return it to the office of the Superintendent of Schools.
