

## Bluestreak - Certification Statement Rules

The following is the order Bluestreak will search for Certifications statements to use for a new certification document. The first Certification Statement that is found “wins”, meaning it will be used to build the statement on the new Certification Document.

1. **Specification(s)** attached at the Order-level (typically these specifications would have come the process used on the work order).
  - a. If multiple specifications are at the order-level, the *Default Certification Statement* will be the aggregation of the the *Default Certification Statement* of each specification, UNLESS the specification attachment to the process has a has a *Modified Certification Statement*.
  - b. When a specification attachment to the process (used on a Work Order) has a *Modified Certification Statement*, then the *Modified Certification Statement* will be used instead of the *Default Certification Statement*.
2. If no specification-based certification statement is found, then each part on the work order will be checked for a **part-specific** certification statement.
  - a. If there are multiple part numbers on the work order, the certification will be the aggregation of each part’s certification statement.
3. If no part-specific certification is found, then the main **process** used on the work order will be checked for a certification, and will be used if found.
4. If no process-specific certification statement is found, then a **system-wide**, short certification statement is checked and used if found.
  - a. This can be found under Setup/Data Defaults - Certification/General, and is named *CertStatement*. The current length is limited to 100 characters, which is enough for simple statements like: “The parts were processed according to the customer’s requirements.”
  - b. HTML text is not supported for this setting.
5. If no certification statement is found at this point, the new certification document will have a blank certification statement, which can then be constructed by the following methods:
  - a. Copy a statement from a previous certification delivered to the customer.
  - b. Construct a statement from the Phrases selector/editor.
  - c. Type the statement from scratch.
