TERMS OF REFERENCE

DIVERSITY EQUITY AND INCLUSION (DEI) DATA GROUP

Purpose

- 1. To develop a taxonomy or classification system describing the methodology of foundations and the recipients of their funding in relation to DEI.
- 2. To develop standard classifications and definitions of widely-used terms related to DEI in order to encourage clarity and shared meanings.
- 3. To encourage and develop the use of consistent DEI data collection methods across the foundation sector and promote best practice of this.
- 4. To encourage transparency and greater sharing of DEI data across the sector
- 5. To promote understanding and analysis of DEI data as a means of achieving DEI through the implementation of good data methodologies and practices.
- 6. To ensure that the way in which data is collected, utilised and shared reflects best practice and centres the lived experience of people

Membership

- 1. Membership is encouraged from all trusts and foundations who are keen to actively engage in this area.
- 2. Membership is also encouraged from other organisations involved on the foundation and charity sector who have an active interest in this area
- 3. At the first meeting, the membership will be asked to volunteer as Chair and Vice-Chair.
- 4. The Chair and Vice- Chair will hold responsibility for the organisation of the meetings, preparation of agendas and ensuring that minutes of the meeting are completed and circulated.
