Sarita Timilsina, a Kathmandu resident, lives in the United States. She is also a representative of the Nepal Open World Cause Organization in the United States. The same organization has been working to improve women's health and education in Nepal. Timalsina is focusing on improving women's health and education in Nepal, even abroad. The same company has also invested in Dang. Ghorahi sub-metropolitan ward. The school has been brought into operation by considering Tharu community and disadvantaged students.

Timalsina said that the Tharu community has invested in the school to provide easy access for an education to the children. "At present, the children of Tharu community have difficulty understanding other languages and their education is affected," she said. Saying that there is a district of abundance, the children of Tharu community here have an easy access to education. We started this class to bring it. '

She said that the children of Tharu community are educating the children by bringing the Tripur Kinder Academy in Narayanpur. 'Some of the Tharu community's children are unable to attend other schools due to financial constraints,' she said.

Initially there were 24 students, but now there are 95 students. Timalsina says most of them are from Valwali in Tharu community. Currently studying from nursery to grade 2. Even now the parents have asked to add grade levels, said Timalsina. 'Now the nursery is being taught from a combined classroom,' she said, 'but the parents are pushing to add even more classes.'

It was only a few days ago that the school was discussed in a community meeting with parent suggestions on how to improve it. On that occasion the parents primary request was to add class. They also suggested to provide additional transportation services, saying that students would come from far and wide. Stating that there is an obligation to pay monthly salary of Rs (rupees).

She said that the students are provided with school lunches and a school van through Open World Cause. She also said that the students are working with technology. 'We have now provided the iPad to the students,' she said, adding that it has made it easier for students to read and use the Internet. Timalsina is working to establish a connection with local governments so Tri Ka can continue to update their classes.

Currently there are 5 teachers working in the academy. The Open World Cause Organization in the USA has been supporting the classrooms in various countries.
