- 5. Continuing in the vein of the community knowing nothing, I was talking to a Juke Juice division captain who made a good point about the much discussed skill disparity this season. To quote, "the 'skill gap' between the former B teamers and former minors players was, predictably, overstated... 95% of the people in this league can hang." - 6. If the newcomers can continue to hang for the rest of the season, that could spell trouble for some of the vet-laden teams in our league. You've got to think that the young balls will continue to improve and that these veterans are somewhat ceilinged out. Something to watch for.
- 7. One of those veteran teams that most thought highly of, Returns of the Jedi, only managed a single win this week. It's a little bit of a shock to see a team with so much talent get beaten soundly like they did. After boogie's majors performance, I expected a lot better out of their offense than what we got. Their Game 3 win is the winning formula for them, with Mike Trout and boogie dominating statistically and WRIG cleaning up on powerups. They need to find a way to be consistent or they're in for an early playoff exit.
- 8. Their opponent, the Thundercaps are a bit of a sleeping giant, in my opinion. Acuraun and dingbat put together a really good performance this week and will continue to be a force the rest of the season. Jazzz came into this week with community perception of her as the clear anchor of this team. After a nine cap performance, I think she's laid those thoughts to rest.

I think the new league structure has really contributed to this and allowed a lot of people to get their opinions out there.
