Dr. Lowenhaupt is a board-certified pediatrician, psychiatrist, and child and adolescent psychiatrist at Rhode Island Hospital/Hasbro Children's Hospital who provides psychiatric treatment and consultation to children, families, and agencies involved in the child welfare and juvenile legal systems. She is an Associate Professor on the Clinician-Educator Track at Brown Alpert Medical School.

Dr. Lowenhaupt is the Co-chair of the Children and the Law Committee of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (AACAP) and represents AACAP on the Board of the National Commission for Correctional Health Care, where she also

serves as the Chair of the Juvenile Health Committee and Chair-Elect.
