## JOB DESCRIPTION EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, IOWA HIGH SCHOOL MUSIC ASSOCIATION

**TITLE:** Executive Director of the Iowa High School Music Association

**EMPLOYMENT OBJECTIVE:** Provide leadership, support and services to high school music education and activities throughout the State of Iowa as approved by the Executive Committee.

## QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Bachelor's Degree required, Master's Degree preferred.
- 2. Strong music background (instrumental-vocal).
- 3. Ability to organize and work with others.
- 4. Ability to make effective public presentations, written and oral, and to develop and maintain positive relations with school personnel, media and the public at all levels.
- 5. Ability to foresee needs and initiate programs to serve the needs of the IHSMA membership.
- 6. Ability to administer and develop new programs.
- 7. Strong interpersonal skills with a demonstrated ability to utilize good judgment and tact as required. Possesses ability to execute significant events and make decisions under pressure; maintains high levels of personal and professional integrity in all situations.
- 8. Computer skills and ability to navigate multiple computer programs is required.

**REPORTS TO:** Executive Committee

**BASIC FUNCTION:** Function as Chief Executive Officer of the IHSMA Executive Committee and provide general supervision and leadership in all aspects of Association operations.

## PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Oversee the duties of the office Administrative Assistant and other IHSAA support staff assisting with IHSMA duties
- Secure host sites for the Marching Band Festival, All-State Auditions, Show-Jazz Choir/Jazz Band Festivals, Solo/Small Ensemble Festival and Large Group Festival
- Recruit and employ adjudicators required by all festivals
- Oversee the Adjudicator Certification process

- Train adjudicators to utilize online adjudication tools
- Attend to payment of adjudicator and site expenses for each festival
- Develop Manager's Handbooks for each festival
- Respond to concerns expressed by administrators and music directors
- Attend conferences and conventions of IBA, ICDA, ISTA and National Federation
- Coordinate efforts of IBA, ISTA and ICDA committees which effect Association festivals
- Advise the Executive Committee of their legal responsibilities and interprets legislation relevant to Music Association activities
- Attend to the computer scheduling for the Solo/Small Ensemble Festival
- Attend to a majority of the correspondence for the Association
- Develop a budget that reflects financial security and reason
- Oversee the printing of the Fall and Spring Bulletin, All-State Festival program, registration forms and other printed materials required by festivals
- Select Marching Bands for state football playoffs and soloists/ensembles to perform National Anthem at state wrestling and basketball tournaments
- Respond to eligibility concerns as they arise
- Serve as the Festival Director for the All-State Music Festival. Those responsibilities include but are not limited to:
  - a. Vet, submit for approval, and contract festival conductors
  - b. Arrange for rehearsal and concert facilities
  - c. Assign schools to motels and secure lodging for conductors, board, and other dignitaries
  - d. Arrange transportation for students
  - e. Arrange eating facilities for students
  - f. Coordinate efforts of Band Chair, Chorus Chair, and Orchestra chair
  - g. Order all music
  - h. Folder band and orchestra music and distribute to audition sites
  - i. Approve event expenditures and ensure timely payment of invoices
  - j. Collaborate with ISU ticketing, plan complimentary seating, and coordinate ticket sales and promotion
  - k. Accommodate and coordinate Teacher Tenure Awards and National Federation Awards

An important aspect of this position is the need to retain a positive and professional relationship with the IHSAA personnel (e.g. coordinating the printing needs of IHSMA with the IHSAA staff will be important).

**EMPLOYMENT:** 12-month contract beginning on July 1, 2023.

**SALARY AND BENEFITS:** To be set annually by the Executive Committee of the Iowa High School Music Association.

**EVALUATION:** Conducted annually in closed session with the Executive Committee of the Iowa High School Music Association.
