## Supreme Council Meeting May 15, 2019

The Supreme Council Meeting on May 15, 2019, was the first ever elder led meeting. Elder Fairfield starts the meeting off by talking about the Olympics progress. So far, periods 4 & 5 have not completed the first event-- the pull-ups, which should be done by the end of the day today. People who don't have a lot of karma points, who are quiet, and don't participate, should be taking part in the Olympics any size, shape, or form. There should be at least two people signed up to help set stuff up for each category, etc. putting the flags out. Period 3, who is running it has started sign-ups and things are starting to move.

It was voted the last meeting, that period 2 would not be allowed to participate in the Olympics, but period 6 Bisma organized a vote for period 2 to participate.
