In support of the SLOBS partnership with the Los Altos Rotary Club and NexTrex Recycling, **members are encouraged to collect plastic recyclables**. We have a target to collect 1000 pounds of plastics in 12 months to earn a bench for our community.

When we recycle our plastic film with NexTrex, not only are we helping to keep waste out of landfills, we're also helping Trex to continue to make eco-friendly outdoor products.

These are examples of acceptable items you may come across:

- ANY plastic film/bags marked with #2 (HDPE) or #4 (LDPE)
- Produce bags for items like bread, fruit, vegetables
- Plastic shopping bags and ziplock bags
- Shipping mailers and bubble envelopes
- Overwrap for items such as bathroom tissue, paper towel and water bottles,

Please DO NOT include compostable bags, bags containing frozen food, pet food, washed salad or meat.

All plastics need to be clean and dry.

THERE WITH CARE: Multiple Volunteer Opportunities

There With Care provides a wide range of thoughtful and fundamental services to families who are in a medical crisis because they have a child/children undergoing treatment for a critical, life-threatening illness at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital Stanford or UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital San Francisco. By volunteering you are helping families who are experiencing food, financial, economic, and/or housing insecurity, and often feel isolated and alone. Your participation and support helps make it possible for families to spend more time with their sick child and one another.
