### **Current State**

- What is painful or frustrating in the current life of my avatar?
- What annoys them?
- What do they fear?
- What do they lie awake at night worrying about?
- How do other people perceive them?
- What lack of status do they feel?
- What words do THEY use to describe their pains and

frustrations?

I used Fusso Coat for the paint, Glaco for the glass and max guard for the wheels. I'll do a chemical decon every 2 months to keep the paint and glass coatings in good order and reapply the wheel wax at the same time

Make sure you have low temp washer fluid. Make sure your tires are at the proper psi and have adequate tread. Get a battery maintainer for the battery and make sure 4 wheel drive engages properly.

You may want to back flush your heater core. Just to keep any potential gunk/rust from forming. It'll help it last longer and heat up your interior quicker, plus it's free and easy to do.

- **1. Check fluid levels:** Your car's oil isn't the only fluid that is negatively affected by winter weather. Windshield wiper fluid and antifreeze are both susceptible to cold temperatures.
- **2. Wash and wax your car:** The wax will help provide an extra layer of protection for both the underbelly and your car's paint job.
- **3. Inspect the battery:** While many batteries have a lifetime of three years, those used in areas with extreme weather conditions need to be replaced every year. Winter can also reduce the battery's capacity to store a charge.
- **4. Install winter tires:** Winter tires are made of more flexible material that doesn't freeze as firm as the rubber in other types of tires.

**5. Change the oil:** New oil is thinner and can better withstand the cold temperatures that would otherwise affect its viscosity.
