- Creating content for email communications and the Free Minds website
- Writing and/or editing content for our magazine, the Free Minds Connect, distributed to 500+ members in the federal prison system
- Assisting with the management of the Free Minds website, including selecting poetry by incarcerated members and processing written responses from readers to be mailed to the incarcerated poets

- Conducting research and/or attending events to learn more about the criminal legal system and system change efforts, with the goal of sharing knowledge with program participants and other staff, interns, and volunteers
- Assisting with the preparation and planning of our "On the Same Page" community engagement program
- Assisting with in-person and virtual events

Specific Deliverable(s):

• The student will be a key partner in our external communications, and will be primarily responsible for the management and growth of our social media presence, with the goals of raising awareness about the lived experiences of people impacted by mass incarceration, and reaching new audiences to continue building a community of support for our incarcerated and formerly incarcerated program participants.
