### Code of Conduct for Working with Children

Wolfstar Archers Club supports and requires all members to observe the following standards of practice, including verbal and non-verbal actions when involved in activities with children.

All concerns about breach of this Code of Conduct will be taken seriously and responded to in line with Wolfstar Archers Club Disciplinary Procedure and Procedure for Responding to Concerns about Child Abuse.

#### **GOOD PRACTICE**

Engaging in rough or physical contact

In the o	context of your role within Wolfstar Archers Club, the following should be regarded as good practice:
	Make sport fun, enjoyable and promote fair play.
	Treat all children equally, with respect, dignity and fairness.
	Involve parents/carers wherever possible.
	Build balanced relationships based on mutual trust.
	Include children in the decision-making process wherever possible.
	Always work in an open environment, wherever possible. Avoid private or unobserved situations.
	Put the welfare of each child first before winning or achieving performance goals.
	Be an excellent role model including not smoking or drinking alcohol in the company of children.
	Give enthusiastic and constructive feedback rather than negative criticism. · Recognise the developmental needs and capacity of children.
	Avoid excessive training and competition, pushing children against their will and putting undue pressure on
	them.
PRAC	CTICE TO BE AVOIDED
	In the context of your role within Wolfstar Archers Club, the following should be avoided:
	Having 'favourites' – this could lead to resentment and jealousy by other children and could be misinterpreted by others
	Spending excessive amounts of time alone with children away from others
	Entering children's bedrooms on trips away from home, unless in an emergency situation or in the interest of
	health and safety. If it is necessary to enter rooms, knock and say that you are coming in. The door should remain open, if appropriate
	Where possible, doing things of a personal nature for children that they can do for themselves
UNA	CCEPTABLE PRACTICE
In the	context of your role within Wolfstar Archers Club, the following practices are unacceptable:
	Engaging in sexually provocative games, including horseplay
