## GWU PSC 2987- Internship 1-3 credits Fall, Spring, Summer semesters

PSC 2987 offers students the opportunity to integrate their learning in the classroom with practical experience in the community.

### Registration Requirements:

- Junior standing (60+ completed credits)
- Declared PSC or PSC policy focus major
- Have a confirmed PSC-relevant internship

#### Policies:

- PSC 2987 is graded pass/ no pass. The credits count, but pass/ no pass courses do not impact GPA
- All work is due the last day of the courses, as defined by the GWU Academic Calendar
- Students can enroll in 2987 multiple times. ONLY 3 credit hours will count towards PSC major requirements; additional credit will count towards graduation credit requirements.
- A student may earn PSC 2987 credit for paid and unpaid internships.
- The deadline to enroll in PSC 2987 is the end of the 5th week of classes. Students are required to complete the full required internship hours and assignments for the semester, regardless of when they formally register for the course.
- No PSC 2987 credit is given retroactively.

#### Registration process:

- Complete PSC 2987 Enrollment Request (requires internship supervisor's signature) AND RTF (not RTF-EZ) webforms (available <a href="here">here</a>)
- Send finalized RTF to your college academic advising office for processing (CCAS Advising, for most students)
- Ensure that your RTF is processed: your credits should appear in degreemap and you should be enrolled in the Blackboard course

#### 2987 course requirements:

To pass the course, you must complete EACH of the 3 required assignments, AND 30 points from the professional

development options.

Poster or video showcase	Share out your internship experience in one of 2 forms:  1. Participate in the department's internship showcase. Create a poster, print, display, and chat with attendees for 1.5 hours (note- spaces are limited, so sign up for your time slot early!). Tips and templates on making a poster are <a href="here">here</a> . Print your poster <a href="here">here</a> (click the 'large-format printing request' link, be sure to select the "class assignments" option, list 'PSC 2987' as the class the project is for, limit your poster size to 24"x36". NOTE: 2 business day processing time!). Upload your poster and a 250+ word reflection of your learning from making and presenting the poster on Blackboard. If you complete the course in the summer, you can complete the poster in the summer, and do the presentation in the next semester.  2. Create a short video (less than 5 minutes) for the PSC website. Upload your video and a 250+ word reflection of your learning from making and the video on Blackboard. We will post some of these on our PSC website to support other students' internship search (see <a href="here">here</a> ). Due on the last day of classes.  Both should address the following:  - Why this field? What professional interests and prior experience impacted your motivation for this internship?  - Getting in the door.
