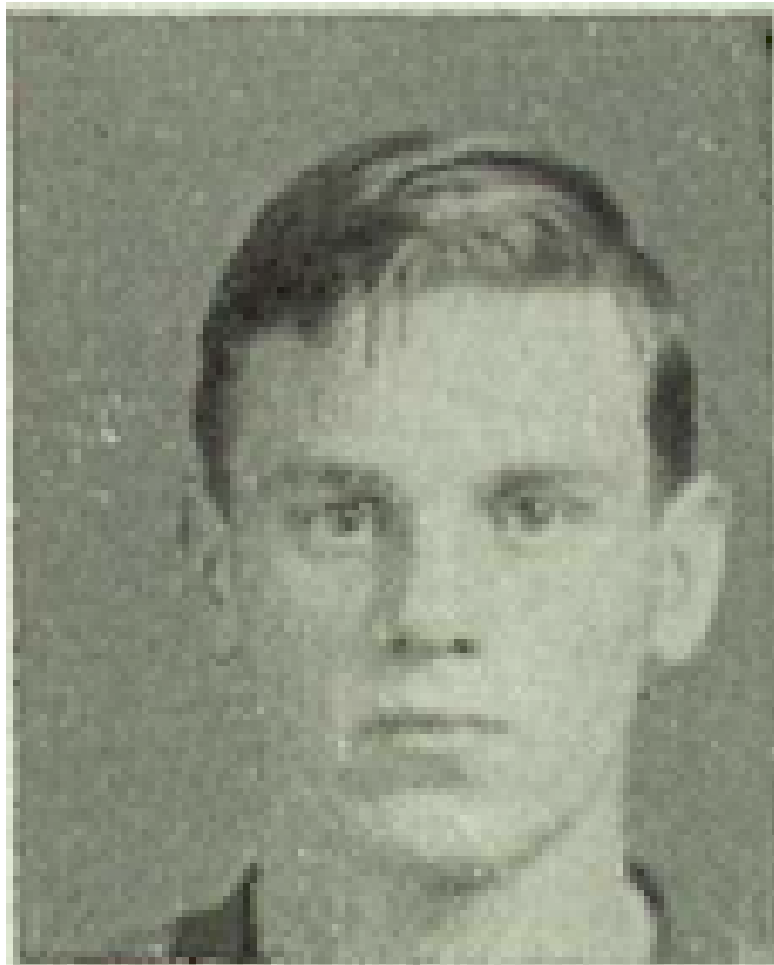


T/5 John T. "Jack" Shea
