## Erate Report

## 1. Constitutionality of USF

#### **History:**

- In July 2024, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals found that the Universal Service Fund (USF) was unconstitutional
- In earlier decisions, both the 6th and 11th Circuit Courts found the opposite that the USF was constitutional
- Both the Justice Department as well as the petitioners petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court to hear the case
- Petition to hear the case and review the 5<sup>th</sup> Circuit ruling granted with oral arguments coming sometime next year
- In the meantime, E-Rate and the other three USF programs are operating and will continue, "business as usual"

#### What Should You Do:

- o Continue with all application processes, just as you have in previous years
- Provide anecdotal impact stories several organizations are gathering color commentary
- I will keep you posted as the case proceeds

#### 2. FY2025 Form 470

- File your FY2025 Form 470 within the next month or so as we still do not know its deadline (which would be 28 days from the last day of the TBA FY2025 Form 471 Filing Window).
- You must file a Form 470 if you want to receive E-Rate for FY2025 and have an expiring contract or want to request reimbursements for new products or services.
- While the ESL lists both school bus wi-fi and off-campus hot spots as eligible, in light of the incoming new administration and upcoming personnel changes at the FCC Commission, I would consider their continued eligibility to be uncertain at best. As the two current Republican FCC Commissioners have previously opposed both initiatives, I strongly encourage any applicants seeking funding for either bus wi-fi or off-campus hotspots to ensure their vendor contracts include an opt out clause in the event of no E-Rate funding as a protective measure in case eligibility is rescinded.

#### 3. FY2025 Administrative Window

- The Administrative Window is open and will close just before the FY2025 Form 471 Filing Window opens, which I anticipate will be in early January.
- During the Administrative Window, you should update your enrollment and NSLP numbers to calculate your E-Rate discount. You are not required to update the enrollment numbers used to determine your Category 2 budget unless you want to due to increased enrollment. You are allowed to use the "most recent accurate numbers" for both of these data points.

### PD Funding - Dennis Kunces

As of today, for this school year, ACTEM has paid out \$5,764 to 3 members and subsidized 12 members for reduced fees for JAMF training.

We also have one member planning on an April 3D printing activity.

The total paid out and encumbered amount is \$6,164.

It is fairly easy for members new to the process as outlined on the ACTEM Website. You apply online for pre-approval and to have the funds encumbered. After reviewing the application, the result is usually 1 or 2 days or less. After finishing the activity, you have 60 days to provide proof of personal payment and course completion. You also complete the short PD survey on the ACTEM website. After we receive these three pieces of documentation, your reimbursement is sent within a few days of submission. Remember ACTEM can only reimburse members and not school districts, so proof of your personal payment (credit card or personal check) is the usual way payment for the activity is documented.
