Dear President Johnson and Members of the Board of Trustees,

I am writing today to urge you to agree to the union's proposal for a one-year contract immediately in order to end the strike. I urge you to make good on your promise to prioritize student learning by remaining at the bargaining table so that an agreement can be reached.

The College has already agreed to the status quo on workload for the next academic year, so I do not see any reason to reject the union's one-year proposal. The College's workload proposal is a drastic change to the current system at Wellesley, which has operated with a four course load for decades. In any given semester, less than 30% of our unit teaches five courses. In addition to teaching, BUEs advise 760 students and supervise 140 independent studies and senior theses. They teach time-intensive labs, language classes, and studio arts classes. 14 BUEs serve as program directors. The College's proposal for BUEs to teach 5 classes per year would require significant curricular and departmental changes to reallocate this labor that students rely on. The College needs more time to develop a workable plan that the Union can consider. A one-year contract gives the College time while ensuring students receive the education they deserve.

A one-year contract benefits the whole College community. Every day that passes without an agreement, students lose the education they were promised. I urge the College to agree to the union's proposal for a one-year contract immediately in order to end the strike.
