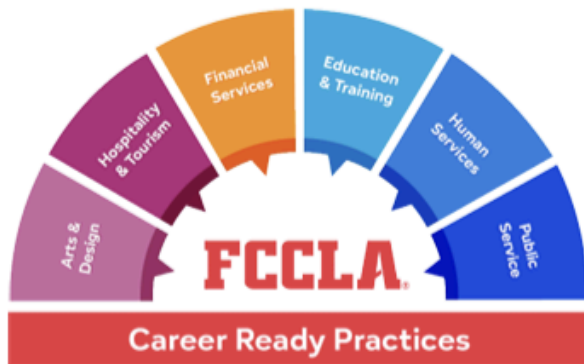

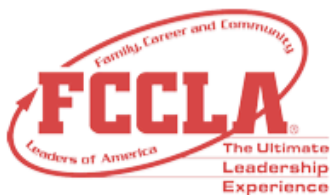

Starting a Club

FCCLA can integrate in FCS teacher classrooms, and started as a club to welcome all members. All affiliated members must:

- Pay a total fee of \$12 to FCCLA Adviser



- Either be interested in FCS related career pathways OR is enrolled in an FCS course (according to [FCCLA Hawaii Constitution](#))

There are roles in FCCLA: National State Advisory Board, National FCCLA Officer, State Advisory Board, State FCCLA Officer, **FCCLA Chapter Adviser, FCCLA Chapter Officer, FCCLA Chapter Members**

- There are no regions or districts in this FCCLA, though it may be common in other state-wide competition related programs

FCCLA does not have specific roles of officers. Advisers are free to do positions that support them best. *Suggested* Chapter Officer Positions and duties:


- President: Lead club meetings, delegate tasks/roles, communicates with State Officers, read the State Newsletters, comes to HI State Monthly Meetings
- Vice President: Support President in duties, takes over President if absent, communicates with State Officers, read the State Newsletters, comes to HI State Monthly Meetings
- Secretary: Takes notes at every meeting, organizes Club files/information
- Treasurer: Tracks/logs money for fundraising, membership dues, and registration fees
- Historian: Attends every event, takes photos, manages club social media, creates fliers/posters/boards, anything needed for promoting your club

Integrating FCCLA in the Classroom

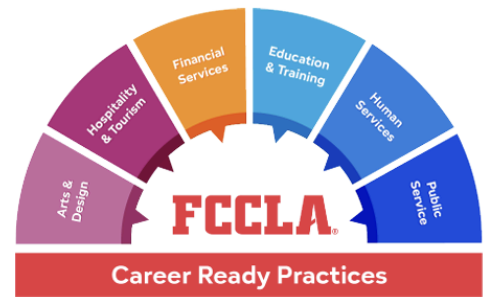

Specific to Culinary Courses*:

Baking and Pastry and Culinary Arts are the only STAR Events that are limited at the State Leadership Conference. This is because Culinary Arts and Baking & Pastry take up a lot of resources (food, shuttle, kitchen space, equipment, time), therefore we have to place a limit in order to finish competitions within one day.

- Limit: 2 students per high school for Culinary Arts
- Limit: 1 student per high school for Baking & Pastry
- Note: These courses are for Juniors and Seniors only!

Because of the limit, we recommend for teachers to conduct their own method of choosing their students, either by conducting a simulated competition of students completing the recipe within your classes and choosing the best, or picking based on your own accord.

- It is common for FCCLA Advisors to run simulated competitions utilizing their own recipes, or an old recipe.
- SLC recipes are released in mid-October.

Affiliated (Registering) Members in the Portal

To get started with the FCCLA Portal, a new advisor should contact their State Adviser first, then visit the portal at affiliation.registermychapter.com/fccla, logging in with their unique chapter ID as the username. The adviser can then submit a request to create a new chapter, choose a membership package, add students via individual entry or a CSV upload, and submit payment for affiliation.

Affiliation Process: How to register members

1. Choose Membership Package:
2. You will be prompted to select from the available membership options for your chapter. Choose the regular one, do not choose unlimited or anything like that.
3. Add Members:
 - a. You have two options for entering your student roster:
 - b. Individual Entry: Type information for each student directly into the portal.
 - c. Bulk CSV Upload: Download the provided CSV template, fill it out, and then drag and drop it into the portal.
4. Click "Submit Affiliation"
5. Click "Create Invoice"
6. After finalizing your roster, you'll need to submit the payment for your chosen affiliation package to make your chapter official. Submit Payment:
 - a. Submit Payment to the FCCLA headquarters address in Virginia using Check or Purchase Order method.

Competitive Events

Competitive Events Language:

- **Levels:** Grade of student (yes, you can have a mix of levels when you compete as well).

- **Planning Process Page:** The Planning Process is a decision-making tool that supports the organization's overall philosophy about youth-centered leadership and personal growth. It can be used to determine group action in a chapter or class or to plan individual projects. A blank FCCLA Planning Process template may be downloaded from the FCCLA Adviser or Student Portal. This template may be modified, but all headings must be used in the correct order. The FCCLA logo, STAR Events logo, and Planning Process graphics are encouraged but not required.
- An **individual event** is one that the individual completes.
- A **team event** is one that 1 – 3 team members complete. (Some STAR Events can have more than 3 team members, please check rubric).
- **State Leadership Conference:** An event where students from HI all can compete, noting the limited STAR Events such as Culinary Arts and Baking & Pastry as mentioned in [Integrating FCCLA in the Classroom](#) (occurs within February)
- **National Leadership Conference:** An event where students compete if eligible, only selected students from State Leadership Conference can* (occurs within June/July)

There are two types of Competitive Events that can be done at the State Leadership Conference:

STAR Events	Skills Demonstration (SDEs)
Students Taking Action with Recognition (STAR) Events are Competitive Events in which members compete at the state and national levels. Students are recognized for proficiency and achievement in chapter and individual	Skill Demonstration Events (SDEs) are national Competitive Events that allow FCCLA Members to demonstrate their college-and career-readiness skills in Family and Consumer Sciences and related occupations. Using established

projects, leadership skills, and career preparation. STAR Events allow students to compete individually or as a team. There are more than 30 STAR Events students can choose to compete in, all of which recognize participants who demonstrate their knowledge, skills, and abilities to actively identify an issue concerning families, careers, or communities, research the topic, and develop and implement a project to advocate for positive change.

STAR Events offer individual skill development and application of learning through the following activities:

- Cooperative – teams work to accomplish specific goals
- Individualized – an individual member works alone to accomplish specific goals
- Competitive – individual or team performance is measured by an established set of criteria

Only top students per level in each category can participate in competing at national level.

SDEs often serve as an introduction to FCCLA's Competitive Events and require a shorter time commitment than STAR Events projects.

Important Information for States

- SDEs are developed and managed by FCCLA National Headquarters. States are only permitted to offer the SDEs that FCCLA specifically releases for state use each year.
- SDEs are not to be used as state qualifying events for participation at the National Leadership Conference.

All FCCLA Members are eligible to compete in a Skill Demonstration Event at the national level.

Students are more than welcome to participate in Online STAR Events, however, they will not be judged at the State Leadership Conference but will enter a Preliminary Round. Instead, students that are competing in Online STAR Events will be volunteering at the State Leadership Conference and will gain leadership skills in the meantime.

Students competing in Online STAR Events have different deadlines compared to regular STAR Events. This is listed on your rubric. All Online STAR Events must be completed, registered, and submitted online in the FCCLA portal by **February 2, 2026**

The "FCCLA Planning Process page" isn't a single page but a five-step framework for setting goals and planning projects used by Family, Career and Community Leaders of America members. The steps are: 1. Identify Concerns, 2. Set a Goal, 3. Form a Plan, 4. Act, and 5. Follow Up. Each Competitive Event at National Leadership Conference (July 6-10, 2026):

In order to compete at National level, students that are placed within the top 2 of their level and category will be eligible to move forward. Students will find out their placing and eligibility during the Awards Ceremony at the State Leadership Conference. Some competitions vary in top number of students eligibility terms of National FCCLA policies. You can find this information in the [first few pages of the STAR Event Binder](#).

STAR EVENTS INFORMATION & ENTRIES PER STATE

An *individual event* is one that the individual completes. A *team event* is one that 1 – 3 team members complete.

It's important to verify with your State Adviser to ensure compliance with state-level regulations regarding the maximum number of entries allowed per state, as this number might be lower than the national allowance.
