District Goal: The district will provide individualized student support by strengthening intervention practices, implementing consistent progress monitoring, and effectively utilizing resources and schedules to support learning opportunities tailored to our students' specific needs.

School Goal: Refine MTSS structures to better inform intervention and acceleration planning.

Action Steps:

- Adopt a consistent Student Support Team (SST) process
- Build dedicated time into school day schedule to conduct grade level data meetings
- Build Open Architect (OA) dashboards to have real time data to use during data meetings
- Create an explainer document about MTSS structures to be used across elementary schools
