



The following are instructions on how to select a designated attorney. If you need instructions on how to accept or deny a request to be someone's designated attorney, please jump to Page 6.

Each attorney needs to complete the Attorney Designation found in their Member navigation.

To select or change your designated attorney, please click the Attorney Designation option in the navigation menu.




You will then select one of the two options shown and click "Save."



If you choose the option that you are exempt from the requirement to name a designated attorney, you are finished with the process.

If you choose the option that you are subject to the Nebraska Attorney Succession Planning Rules, you will see the following appear and you will click "Designate New Attorney."



Please certify (a), (b), and (c) and then enter in the attorney you are searching for either by bar number and/or first name and/or last name, and select them from the list.

Your selection will then appear under "Designated Attorney" in the "Attorney Information" section.


Click "Submit" once you have confirmed your selection.

After making a selection and clicking "Submit," you will be redirected to the Attorney Designation Management page where you will see that your current designated attorney is in a "Pending Approval" status.



You will receive an email letting you know if the attorney approved or denied your request. If they approved it, you will see the following update/change on the Attorney Designation page:



If you have been chosen to serve as someone's Designated Attorney, you will see this task on your task list. It shows who the requesting attorney is and that it is in a "Pending Approval" status. Click the magnifying glass to view the request.



You will see who the Requesting/Planning Attorney is, as well as yourself under Designated Attorney. Scroll to the Workflow Status section and either accept or reject the request, then click "Submit."



The Requesting/Planning Attorney who sent you the request will receive an email letting them know of your decision, and you will be redirected to the Attorney Designation Management page where you can review your who you are Designated Attorney for and who your Designated Attorney is, as well as the history of those designations. You also have the option to remove yourself as someone's Designated Attorney.

If you have not yet chosen a Designated Attorney, you will have the option to do so. Please see the instructions starting on Page 2 to guide you through that process.
