Senior Planning Timeline 2025-2026

September

- Check SEHS Work-in-Progress transcript to confirm that graduation requirements will be completed (enough credits in each subject, incomplete grades updated to complete).
- Send transcripts from schools other than SEHS that show credits earned off campus to South's registrar, Melinda Shull (shull@4j.lane.edu), if you want them to count towards SEHS graduation.
- If you haven't already, complete the Junior Project Course in <u>Canvas</u> (mini independent-study college/career readiness course).
- Register to take or retake the <u>SAT</u> or <u>ACT</u> in the fall, if necessary.
- September 1 (ish): <u>Oregon Promise Grant</u> application opens for Oregon community-college-bound students to submit.

October

- Finalize a list of colleges or post-high school programs where you plan to apply. Attend
 college-rep visits and college fairs, and visit colleges in person to help you decide. Check out
 <u>Finding a College that Fits</u>, a 25-minute video specific to SEHS students (recorded in 8/2024).
- Search websites of selected colleges to see the financial aid/scholarships each school offers, how to apply for the aid, and applicable deadlines.
- <u>Schedule</u> and complete your Senior Interview with your counselor during the first semester.
 Seniors applying for early-action or early-decision admission should schedule their interview for sooner rather than later.
- Once you know where you want to apply, begin doing so. The <u>Common App</u> allows you to apply to many colleges at once with a single application.
- If you are 4-year-college bound, pick up the Purple Packet from Jessica Kuehn (secretary in the
 counseling center) and begin completing it. This is a critical part of the 4-year-college
 application process.
- October 1: First day to submit <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>ORSAA</u>. (The college-bound senior and <u>parent(s)</u> must all create separate FSA IDs before filling out the FAFSA.)
- October 1: First day to submit <u>CSS Profile</u> to access institutional financial aid (aid from a college). Check the <u>CSS Profile Participating Institutions and Programs</u> list to see if your schools require the Profile.
- October 23: SEHS Financial Aid Night Webinar, a virtual event beginning at 7 pm about paying for college. 2025 event recording: SEHS Financial Aid Night webinar
- If you are a Classic South senior and have selected the <u>Senior Experience</u> as your Senior Project, begin it early. Ask your counselor if you have questions about it. Other Senior Project options include CAS hours plus the extended essay for IHS students, the <u>SEHS CTE Project</u> or <u>4J CTE Project (aka CALCI Program)</u> for Classic South seniors, and the <u>Outdoor Leadership CAM</u> for Classic South seniors, all of which have their own timelines, which are shared with students by the classroom teachers of the various projects.

November-December

- November 1-February 15: 4-year college applications due to most 4-year colleges
- November 1: Common early-action deadline for 4-year colleges
- November 1: OSAC Scholarship applications available
- **November 6**: SEHS FAFSA/ORSAA Completion Workshop @ 6:30 pm in room 6. Complete the FAFSA or ORSAA at SEHS with help from experts.

November-December (cont'd)

- November 15: Regular admission deadline for the University of Washington
- December 1: Regular admission deadline for all University of California and California State University schools
- <u>Junior/Senior Resources</u> newsletter rollout. Includes useful tips for juniors and seniors.

January

- January 1: LCC Foundation Scholarship application available (approximate date)
- January-April: If you are a Classic South senior and have selected the <u>Senior Experience</u> as your Senior Project, present your display board at one of the Senior Experience Showcases. Ask your counselor if you have guestions about this.
- January-May: Apply for private scholarships. Most, but not all, deadlines fall in this range.

February-March

- February: Counselors send the Senior Parent Mailing, a letter that details each student's Senior Interview checklist, transcript, and graduation timeline.
- **February 3:** Submit Lane Community College applications after this date for best course placement results (after semester 1 grades have been assigned), but apply soon after to get the most benefit from financial aid.
- February 15: 4-year college applications due to most colleges before now
- **February 17**: Early Bird deadline for <u>OSAC Scholarship</u> application. (Error-free applications entered into a drawing for \$1,000 Early Bird Scholarship)
- March 2: Regular deadline for OSAC Scholarship application
- March 3: Regular deadline for LCC Foundation Scholarship application

April

- Late March/early April: Graduation announcements distributed
- April 1: College-admission and financial-aid offers sent to students from 4-year colleges by today
- **Mid-April**: Counselors notify families of seniors who are not cleared to participate in graduation ceremony by this date
- Order final transcripts from South to be sent to the college you will attend in the fall.

May-June

- January-May: Apply for <u>private scholarships</u>. Apply for <u>private scholarships</u>. Most, but not all, deadlines fall in this range.
- May 1: Deadline to decide where to enroll for applicants to most U.S. colleges and universities
- May: Caps and gowns distributed
- June 1: Oregon Promise application deadline
- June 5: Last day of school for seniors
- June 5: IHS graduation (usually 7 pm at the Hult Center)
- June 9: SEHS graduation (usually 7 pm at the Hult Center)
