

Chronological Documents for World History

This document was created in an effort to provide teachers with examples of primary source documents that could be used to address the objectives in different chronological periods of World History. This is by no means an exhaustive list and does not represent a curriculum. This document instead provides potential sources that might be integrated into a teacher's curriculum and lesson plans to provide students with additional material to analyze and evaluate. In some instances, a specific primary document could not be pointed to as the objective is more complex. In those cases, a general topic has been suggested that teachers could find documents relating to multiple perspectives of that topic. The links at the top can be used to go straight to the strand indicated. The footer in every page contains a link that will bring you back to the top of the document. If you have other suggestions for specific documents that could be used with specific objectives within one of the time frames, please submit that information in the appropriate space provided, located in the footer of every page.

A note on selecting texts: Because North Carolina is a local-control state, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) does not provide lists of resources outlining specific reading texts, books, authors, or other primary and secondary resources. These are decisions that are left to the decision-making of local central office curriculum teams and the educators in the local schools. As a state agency, responsible for the facilitation of standards' revisions and the creation of support documents and professional development to support the successful implementation of standards, we strongly suggest Public School Units (PSUs) determine and develop their own lists of reading texts, books, authors, and other primary and secondary sources, for each grade and course, based on the availability of resources, student populations, student interests, and differentiated levels of academic depth and complexity. Social Studies leadership in local PSUs should carefully analyze the resources they want to use in each grade and course by ensuring those resources respond to the core concepts of the objectives that they want students to understand, that the resources are authentic to the subject area, and that they are accessible.

ADVISEMENT: It is highly recommended that teachers make determinations regarding how students will access primary sources. No links have been provided in this document as they can change and/or include interpretations. Additionally, teachers should make informed decisions regarding passages that are appropriate and applicable to teaching and learning of specific social studies objectives.
