# Old Business

## • Legislative Update - Director Klein

- Working on the implementation of Senate Bill 206. Briefing June 13th on the current disasters with the Executive Committee and the Joint Budget Committee (JBC). In the process of developing our legislative agendas as state agencies for submission early next month. This is similar to what was done last year with the Cyber subcommittees; coming up with some ideas that are translated into budget requests. Submit legislative ideas to Kevin.
- Director Hilkey There is a chance that the legislature could change parties this year. Advise anyone considering a legislative concept to secure sponsors as early as possible.

#### **New Business**

#### Election Security – Director Klein

Met with the Secretary of States (SOS) Office about creating a subcommittee to address election security with the counties leading up to the November elections. Election security is now one of the priorities for the Homeland Security Grant Program and how the locals apply for that. It would bring in a broader perspective than the Public Safety focus. This committee will be formed by volunteers and the Chief Election Official of the State has offered to be the Chair if Director Hilkey approves.

- Matt Mueller Supports the idea.
- Ed Garner Is there a statewide plan for election security?
  - o Director Klein The Secretary of State's Office has a plan for that and he will ask if this plan has been propagated to the counties.

• Director Hilkey – He approves and will solicit volunteers and move forward.

#### Question about Title 42 – Matt Mueller

El Paso Texas is reaching out to every jurisdiction within 750 miles of the border, and has contacted Denver to determine their capacity to take migrants as part of their non-profit effort. In 2019, the non-profits and Denver were able to help with a low-level response. Their concern in El Paso is that they are getting support from the State of Texas with security efforts but very little help with the humanitarian side. Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has provided reimbursements to nonprofits for sheltering and food and is not doing much at this time. Their concern is if Title 42 goes away, they will see a two to three times increase in the number of people coming over the border and not be able to accommodate them. Is Colorado considering a plan to help with these efforts if needed?

- O Director Klein He and Director Hilkey have been engaged in briefings with Department of Homeland Security (DHS). They anticipate a surge of 18,000 immigrants a day and then a decrease. They have looked at funding sources and combining it with the other refugee work that has been done in the past. They are waiting to see what actually happens there.
- o Director Hilkey Title 42 was a memo issued by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) that slowed down the natural civil immigration and asylum-seeking process into the country. It was a CDC/COVID focused method and as a result, the memo may now go away as those restrictions are lifted. If the memo goes away, it reverts us back to the normal system that we had prior to COVID. This signals those wanting to cross the southern US borders, and may increase the numbers of immigrants crossing exponentially.
- Ray Yepes He comes from Texas and has contacts with most every agency in Texas. Contact him with any issues regarding this in Texas.
- Ian Anderson Include him in any conversations that would be beneficial for Volunteers Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) agencies and any other VOAD networks. He can check in with Texas VOADs for needed feedback or assistance.

  - o Ray Yepes He is meeting with the Cybersecurity group the week of June 13th. OIT will start a self- insuring program for the state that will ensure better benefits, lower cost to the agencies, and a savings if they do not have any incidents.

  - o The last meeting was May 27th with 13 members attending. Concerns mentioned were the ghost gun uptick, for which a Situational Awareness Bulletin (SAB) is being drafted. Also discussed were auto theft increases, energy sector collaboration efforts and fentanyl overdose increase. The Colorado Information Analysis Center

(CIAC) is monitoring Juneteenth celebration threat checks, Stanley Cup finals, and creating a SAB for the Patriot Front group that were arrested over the weekend for planning to commit riots.
