Class Rotations

Student Planner

All students will receive a planner on the first day of school, unless they opted to purchase their own. Students are expected to record at home learning assignments and important dates in their planner. This will prepare them for middle school and beyond when they will be expected to keep track of assignments and create checklists of tasks to complete.

Students are also encouraged to bring a water bottle. Please make sure your water bottle is clearly labeled with your name. Everyone is allowed access to his/her water bottle at all times in our classroom.

Frequently Asked ?'s

Q: Who will my teacher be?

A: Each student will be assigned to a homeroom teacher. You will see each of the sixth grade teachers for your core classes.

Q: Where do I enter the building?

A: Sixth grade is housed in the mobiles. If you need to enter the building prior to school starting you can enter through the lower playground doors.

Q: Who do I email when I have a question?

A: For information regarding assignments, please check your child's planner/Google Classroom/Homework page.. If the answer is not provided, you may email the core teacher. For general questions, contact your homeroom teacher.

Q: Can I use my cell phone in school?

A: We understand that some students will need to have a cell phone to contact parents. If you bring a cell phone to school it must be turned off (or placed on airplane mode) and left in your backpack throughout the school day. You may continue your use of the cell phone once you exit the building.

Q: What do I do if I am absent?

A: If you are absent or miss a class for any reason it is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to check in with your teacher, either through email or during your core classes when you return.

<u>Literacy</u>

We utilize the Wonders program. This program is designed to foster a love of reading in all children. Through exploration of texts and daily development of their skills as readers, writers, speakers, and active listeners, students experience the power of literacy. The focus is on teaching the whole child – and every child – preparing students to be lifelong learners and critical thinkers.

Students will have access to both printed and online materials and resources. There are also a variety of exciting games and activities that align with the concepts being taught in class.

<u>Math</u>

In math, students will build on their previous understanding of math concepts. We will work on building personal responsibility through engaging, student-centered activities that build a growth mindset.

We will be using the Ready Classroom Math program. Most materials can be accessed online and students will also receive a consumable workbook.

SEL

We utilize the Wayfinder program. Students will work through weekly lessons to help them learn to identify and work through social situations and conflicts.

Social Studies

We will be exploring the geography and rich history of the Western Hemisphere and how different cultures have interacted and influenced one another. Students will also identify and analyze different economic systems and various systems of government. In addition, students will be reading about and discussing a variety of current events and their impact on the world.

Science

Students will learn to "Think like a scientist" utilizing the skills we build with our growth mindset study. Through scientific exploration and research students will learn about concepts related to life, earth and physical science through the STEMScopes program. Students practice writing CERs (Claim, Evidence, Reasoning)

Outdoor Education
