Students will have to create an account to borrow and borrowing period is 14 days, BUT it used to be that only a couple copies could be borrowed at one time, but until June 30, they have removed the borrowing limits. More information here

So here's a scenario:

- 1)You make an account here https://archive.org/account/signup
- 2)Search for a title you'd like a group of students to read. I searched The Fault in Our Stars by John Green.
- 3)After you found and selected a book, send students the signup link above and they each check it out as an epub

version.

4) Remember the hitch is that they have 14 days, so ideally they are all checking it out within a day or two of each other so they have the maximum time to read. (Although with the waitlist suspended it seems as though they could go back in and check it out again, but I don't know that for sure.

- 1. Go to the <u>VOL site</u> normally
- 2. Choose All Resources and then Popular Magazines

- 3. On the right, Click *Go To Publication Search*, and enter the magazine/newspaper you're looking for. Unfortunately, I do not see Outdoor, but Outdoor Life, Backpacker, National Geographic, and others are on the list. Like Linda said, there can be embargos or limitation on dates. There are also a wide range of other periodicals for kids, teachers, and parents.
- 4. Click on the magazine/newspaper you want, and select an issue by date. You'll see all of the articles in that issue.

<u>Junior Library Guild Digital</u> is providing teachers and students "unlimited access* to read books online from any device. There is no limit to the number of users who can access the books, so tell your home-bound students to click to their hearts' content!
