The afternoon is organised around two sessions. First, a small panel of academic librarians addresses the role of academic library for the future of OA initiatives. This is followed by a longer sessions during which small groups will brainstorm topics that emerged during the morning session as barriers to an open access future. Possible topics are 1) effecting the transition from a market approach to an open approach; 2) ensuring scalability of current OA projects; 3) enabling OA publishing ventures to become competitive with commercial ventures; 4) establishing broad collaboration among OA publishing ventures, and 5) securing a foothold for OA publications in the small club of career-enhancing journal outlets.
