

The Proxy Act

1. All members of Canadian government, excluding members of the judiciary, may designate a proxy to act on their behalf in case of absence
 - a. This proxy must be a Canadian citizen.
 - b. This proxy must not be a member of the judiciary
 - c. No individual may concurrently proxy for more than one (1) person at a time.
 - d. Proxies must, to the best of their ability, enact the will of the member of government they are proxying
