Third section: Title, Authors and Affiliations

Title: Concise and informative. Avoid abbreviations and formulae where possible. Not more than 20 words (Arial 10, bold)

Author names: It should be written completely (Arial 10, bold)

Affiliations (Arial 9, italic)

Note: Where the family name may be ambiguous (e.g., a double name), please indicate this clearly. Present the authors' affiliation addresses (where the actual work was done) below the names. Indicate all affiliations with a lower-case superscript letter immediately after the author's name and in front of the appropriate address. Provide the full postal address of each affiliation, including the country name and, if available, the e-mail address of each author. Please indicate the corresponding author who will handle correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication, also post-publication.

Fourth section: Title and Abstract

Title: Concise and informative. Avoid abbreviations and formulae where possible. Not more than 20 words (Arial 10, bold, 1.5 lines)

Abstract (Arial 10, bold, italic, 1.5 lines)

A concise and factual abstract is required. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, methodology, the principal results and major conclusions. An abstract is often presented separately from the article, so it must be able to stand alone. For this reason, References should be avoided, but if essential, then cite the author(s) and year(s). Also, non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided, but if essential they must be defined at their first mention in the abstract itself. No more than 250 words. (Arial 10; maximum 250 words, 1.5 lines)

Keywords: Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of 5 keywords, general and plural terms should be avoided (Arial 10)

Abstrak (Arial 10, tebal, miring, spasi 1,5)

Diperlukan abstrak yang ringkas dan faktual. Abstrak harus menyatakan secara singkat tujuan penelitian, metodologi, hasil utama dan kesimpulan utama. Abstrak seringkali disajikan terpisah dari artikel, sehingga harus bisa berdiri sendiri. Untuk alasan ini, referensi harus dihindari, tetapi jika perlu, kutip penulis dan tahun (-tahun). Selain itu, singkatan yang tidak standar atau tidak umum harus dihindari, tetapi jika penting, singkatan tersebut harus didefinisikan saat pertama kali disebutkan dalam abstrak itu sendiri. Tidak lebih dari 250 kata. (Arial 10; maksimal 250 kata, 1.5 lines)

Kata kunci: Segera setelah abstrak, berikan maksimal 5 kata kunci, istilah umum dan jamak harus dihindari (Arial 10, 1.5 lines)

Fifth section: Article body

1. Introduction (Arial 10, bold)

State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results. (Arial 10, 1.5 lines)

2. Material and methods (Arial 10, bold)

Provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. Methods already published should be indicated by a reference: only relevant modifications should be described. (Arial 10, 1.5 lines)

3. Results and Discussion (Arial 10, bold)

Results should be clear and concise. Discussion should explore the significance of the research work while extensive citations and discussion of published literature should be avoided. A separate Results and Discussion is often appropriate. **All figures and tables should be presented after references.** (Arial 10, 1.5 lines)

4. Conclusions (Arial 10, bold)

The main conclusions of the study may be presented in a short Conclusions section, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section. (Arial 10, 1.5 lines)

Acknowledgements (Arial 10, bold)

Acknowledgements contains a list of individuals or institutions who provided help during the research (e.g., sampling taken, providing language help, writing assistance or proof reading the article, etc.). (Arial 10, 1.5 lines)

References (Arial 10, bold)

(Arial 10, 1.15 lines, hanging 0.5 inch)

One reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication. Scientific names should be written in italic. Omni-Akuatika strongly suggests using reference management software such as Mendeley, JabRef, etc. The citation in text and bibliography are APA style

Examples in the manuscript body :

"...The application of marine bioremediation in Indonesian water is relatively new (Weber et al., 1994a; Weber et al., 1994b; Heipieper et al., 1995). Biomass estimations were calculated according to

Smith et al. (1986). White et al., (2014) have recently shown"

Sixth section: figures and tables

1. Please provide good quality of figures (minimum 150 dpi) described in the article body (include relevant captions)
2. Please provide all tables described in the article body (including titles, description, footnotes)
3. Ensure all figure and table citations in the text match the ones provided
4. Indicate clearly if color should be used for any figures in print
5. Figure captions: Number figures consecutively with Arabic numerals in accordance with their appearance in the text. Ensure that each illustration has a caption. A caption should comprise a brief title (not on the figure itself) and a description of the illustration. Keep text in the illustrations themselves to a minimum but explain all symbols and abbreviations used.
6. Tables: Number tables consecutively with Arabic numerals in accordance with their appearance in the text. Avoid vertical rules. Be sparing in the use of tables and ensure that the data presented in tables do not duplicate results described elsewhere in the article. Tables should never be included within the text, because file(s) containing tables are attached separately in the electronic submission system
