*It should be highlighted that the main goal in asking these questions was to understand someone's opinion surrounding decentralization and web3.

PRAGMATIC (@ATLNerd)

Q: What does Web3 mean to you?

A: "Web3 is using decentralized ledger technology to give the power and autonomy to the creators and users to build a community outside of a plutocracy..."

SHARK ANTHONY (@SharkAnth0ny)

Q: What imprint do you want to have after conversations or collaborations with other [Web3] artists?

A: "Just be a risk taker, in a space like Web3, just take that risk...this is the space to go for it and try it. You will see that the community is really receptive, so just be a risk-taker. Do a different approach to things, because I've seen that it is really rewarding..."

Q: What enthralled you to build and dive so deep into the metaverse itself?

A: "I think for me, it's the best chance at international exposure as an independent artist. You could play at your local [dive] bar, but for me, it's the best chance at international exposure..."

GRL JACKIE (@grljackie)

Q: In what way have you been impacted by having the ability to reach out and make that initial connection with others in the Web3 space?

A: "I'm so proud of all of the artists, seeing them curate their own events or connecting with others all based on the capability that Web3 has given. It's changing my life and those around us..."

JADYN VIOLET (@jadynviolet)

Q: In five years where do you see our day-to-day life being incorporated with technology and decentralization?

A: "For me, in five years I would like to use this technology to increase convenience. I think the world revolves around things that increase convenience and make things easier to accomplish..."

Q: What do you feel when you hear the term 'decentralization'?

A: "We are able to be our own government, be our own force, be our own movement. We can make our own rules [and lows], while still respecting each other and loving each other. Now, will that last forever? Maybe not, if the

corporations come in...I think at the end of the day as long as the people move with the people, we will always succeed."
