



Anloga Market Fire: A Devastating Blow to Traders

The Anloga Market in the Volta Region of Ghana was struck by tragedy on Tuesday, January 21st, 2025, when a fire broke out, destroying goods worth thousands of Ghana cedis. The fire, which reportedly started around 15:00 hours, originated from a wooden storehouse within the market. Eyewitnesses suggest the blaze may have been sparked by a nearby bush fire that spread to the structure.

The swift response of the Ghana National Fire Service (GNFS) was commendable, preventing the fire from spreading further and causing even more damage. However, despite their efforts, many traders suffered significant losses. One trader who lost her entire stock of plastic wares was reportedly inconsolable.

Market authorities have expressed their sympathy for the affected traders and have pledged to engage with them to determine the next steps. While the GNFS has yet to issue an official statement on the cause of the fire, the incident serves as a stark reminder of the importance of fire safety measures in public spaces.
