Stage 1: Profiling

Task: *Who* are you, *Where* are you based and *Why* are you here?

1. Complete the Profile block below with the information requested (6 questions + photo/picture/image). Most social networking sites, e.g. Facebook or LinkedIn, ask users to upload a photograph of themselves so that they can be recognized by other users. Nonetheless, sometimes users choose to upload images that represent something about themselves. As part of this profile, we would also ask you to add an image that represents something about you that you might want to communicate to a potential partner. Please do NOT use a headshot. You may upload more than one picture.

2. Expand the Profile by adding 6-8 profile items with additional information you think would be important for a potential partner to know about you as a professional, as a person, and about your institutional setting.
