Introduction

Due to the difficulty of registering as an INGO in China, our work will mainly rely on partnerships with local Chinese stakeholders in the next few years, and the main goals of the near future will still be networking with local Chinese stakeholders and establishing promising partnerships with them.

- 2022 is **focused on building partnerships with ICCAW and other Chinese stakeholders** to introduce the concept of "aquatic animal welfare", to understand the current situation of aquatic animal welfare in China better, and to launch the standards-building work and welfare improvement research work.
- In 2023, we will continue working with ICCAW and other research institutes, **focusing on standards-building and welfare improvement research**, trying to develop the research and advocacy team, and networking with promising industries.
- In 2024, we aim to have stable partnerships with different Chinese stakeholders to cover **research**, **standards-building**, **and advocacy**. These are the three areas we are most interested in as avenues to generate better fish lives. We want to investigate these avenues, see how promising they are, and then make an overarching theory of change for how to help fish based on that knowledge. At the same time, we aim to have a good relationship with industries for further industry commitment.
